### Mass Tidbit:

You may have noticed that St. Joseph's now has a new set of vestments. Vestments are what the priest or deacon wears during Mass. The priest wears a chasuble in the color of the liturgical season. A chasuble would have been a formal coat worn by people in the late Roman Empire, but priests still wear them during the liturgy.


Underneath the chasuble the priest wears an alb, a white robe that covers his street clothing, with a cincture, or rope belt, to keep the alb from flowing every which way. He then dons his stole, which is a long narrow strip of fabric that goes around his neck and hangs down his front and is a symbol of the office of the priesthood. He then puts on his chasuble over the alb and stole.

A deacon also wears an alb and cincture, but has a different type of stole, which goes vertically across his chest and hangs on one side, and a dalmatic, which is like a chasuble, but has sleeves and a different design to mark the office of deaconate.

The new vestments were donated by a parishioner and were handmade in England. They are very high quality and should last for centuries. They also have on the back the crest of the Dominican Province of St. Joseph, which is our province.

The crest has as its border the black and white cross of the Dominican Order, with the crest of St. Joseph superimposed, which is blue with 3 lilies, which represent St. Joseph's purity, and a carpenter's rule, since St. Joseph was a carpenter. Because St. Joseph is the patron both of our province of Dominicans and the parish, it seemed natural to add the crest to the vestments.

Here is the crest of the whole Order of Preachers (aka: Dominicans) and our Provincial Crest:

**THIRTY- FORTH SUNDAY

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST OF THE  
UNIVERSE**

**First Reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-3**

Samuel describes how all the tribes of Israel went to David in Hebron and said they were his bone and his flesh and it was he who led them back to Israel. The Lord told David he would be a shepherd to His people. David made an agreement with the elders and was anointed king.

**Second Reading: Colossians 1:12-20**

Paul explains to the Colossians that God has made them fit to share in the inheritance of the holy ones in light and that through the Son we have redemption and forgiveness of sin. He describes Jesus as the image of the invisible God, the head of the church and in Him all things hold together.

**Gospel: Luke 23:35-43**

Jesus is mocked by the crowd as he hung on the cross. Above him was an inscription that read "This is the king of the Jews." One of the men being crucified with Jesus tells Him to save them and Himself, while the other asks that he be remembered when Jesus is in his kingdom. Jesus said in reply, "Amen I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."


