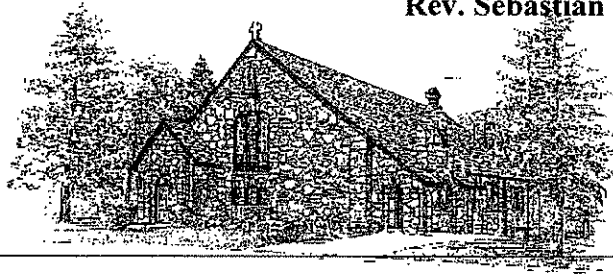

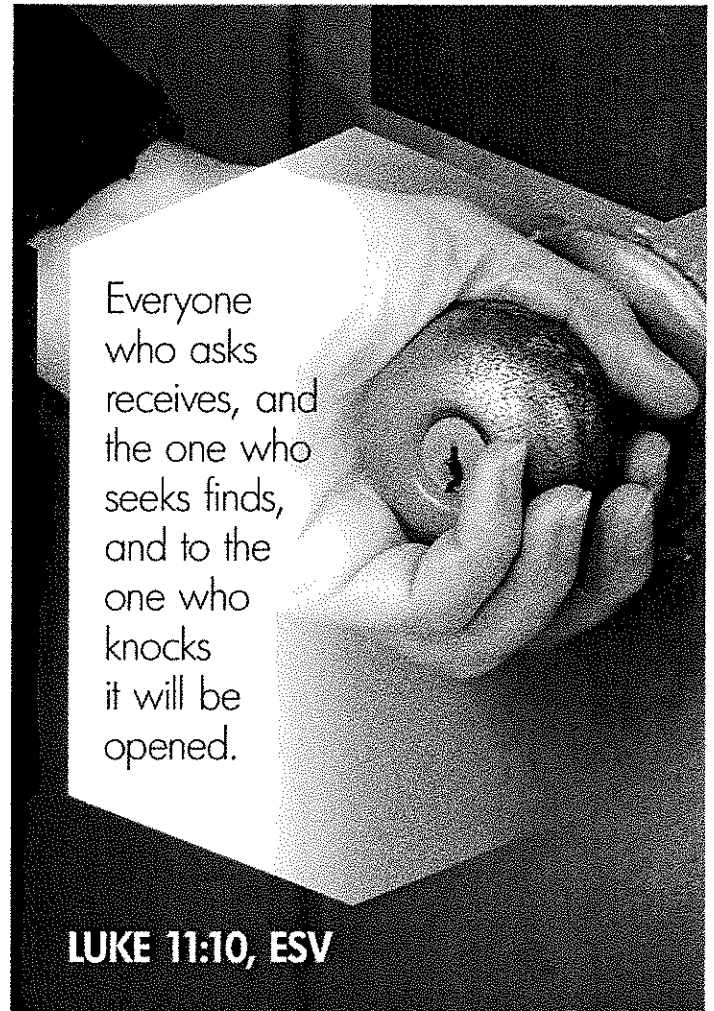
PARISH MEMBERSHIP

As many of you already know, I was not be able to begin my ministry at Holy Rosary as originally planned on July 1st. My next appointment with the orthopedic surgeon is on July 30 and depending upon how the bones are mending, I will advance to the 'light weight bearing' stage. Unfortunately, no one is giving me a definite time span as to how much longer it will be before I am able to join you at Holy Rosary.

From what I have been told, Fr. Sebastian has been doing a wonderful job and I would like to personally thank him for all he has done. I am looking forward to meeting both the members of Holy Rosary as well as Fr. Sebastian in the not-too-distant future.

From the desk of Rev. Robert J. Sweeney

The song “*Thanks For The Memories*” became so associated with one of the many people named “Bob” that he adopted it as his theme-song. Today, I thankfully echo that refrain.

When first told about Holy Rosary as a possible future assignment, a quarter century ago, it was suggested that I scope out Greenwood Lake to see if I would be interested in being assigned here. I arrived in “mufti”, unrecognizable as a priest. Walking into the church I fell in love with the building and its architecture. It looked and felt like a real church. But as beautiful as a building might be, it is not the parish.

To test my theory, I stopped in one of the local eateries and asked for a “happy waitress.” She proved to be one, and confirmed my belief that the foundation of the parish, any parish, is not brick-and-mortar but the people, who shape and mold the parish community and gives it life. You who are reading this, whom I will see later today are the parish and make our Liturgy live. The Liturgy lives so we can “give thanks” and obtain life, life eternal, which is our faith.

Early in 1954, when Holy Rosary was established as a parish, and Monsignor Joseph Kennedy was the first pastor, Mrs. McNally was the housekeeper. 40 years later, I was assigned as the fifth pastor of Holy Rosary, and having been informed by the then housekeeper Maryfrances, that I shouldn’t “miss out” on a great Saint Patrick’s day dinner/celebration, I opted for corn beef and cabbage at Murphy’s. When I arrived all tables had been taken, and there was “no room at the inn”. Monsignor Kennedy’s spirit must have prompted Mrs. McNally’s daughter to warmly invite me to join her and her family for dinner at Murphy’s that St. Patrick’s Day, the first of many Saint Patrick’s Day dinners we shared. It became “tradition.”

The families that invited me for Sunday dinner, taught me how to play cards and had me over for Christmas are all part of what keeps us, priests, human. That is the only reward needed. For a quarter of a century Greenwood Lake, the parish and people of Holy Rosary Church adopted me as part of their family.

Now “retired,” I received a letter from Cardinal Dolan reminding me that a priest is only “retired” from his canonical assignment. For when we were ordained, we were ordained “a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek.”

Having had a month to adapt to a slower pace, I thank each and every one of you for the kindnesses you have showered upon me and it is with these thoughts in mind that I say: “Thanks for the memories.”
