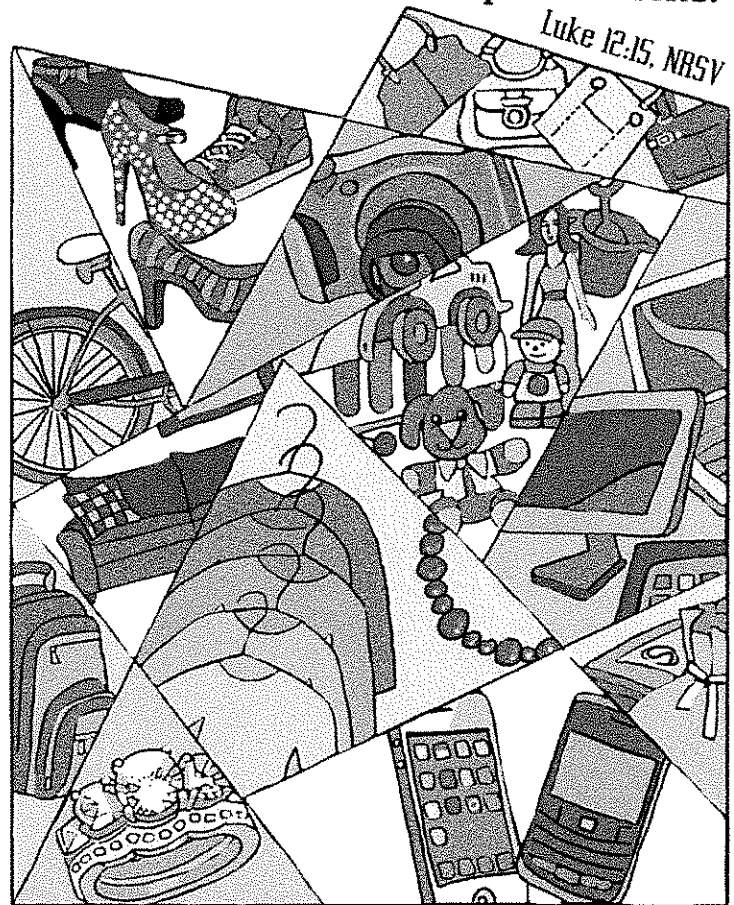

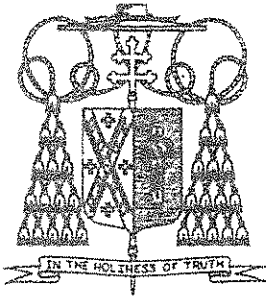

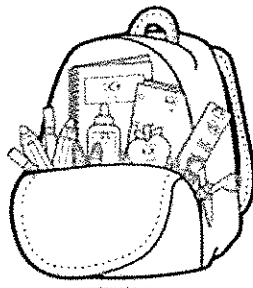

I am happy to report that this past Tuesday the orthopedic doctor gave me the OK to begin full weight-bearing activities, with assistance, on my injured leg. This basically is my ticket to freedom, i.e. discharge. I will be staying at Cabrini probably until next Tuesday. Since I have not used my injured leg for the past seven weeks it is a bit weak and unsteady and I will need more therapy before I leave. Once I am discharged I will have to continue with physical therapy two or three times a week for the next several weeks.

My current plans are to go from Cabrini to the parish. Once there I would like to unpack and begin to familiarize myself and get acquainted with the working of the parish. I would like to thank Fr. Sebastian and Jane for all the work they have been doing during my time of absence. I would also like to thank all of you for your prayers and support. Please continue to keep me in your prayers.
