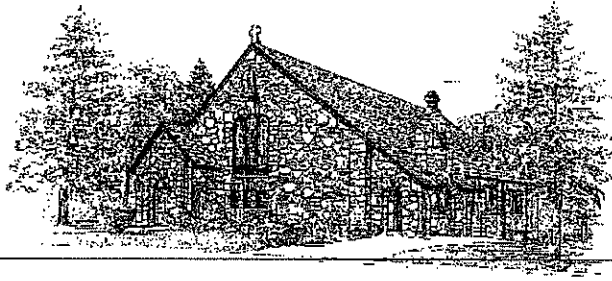

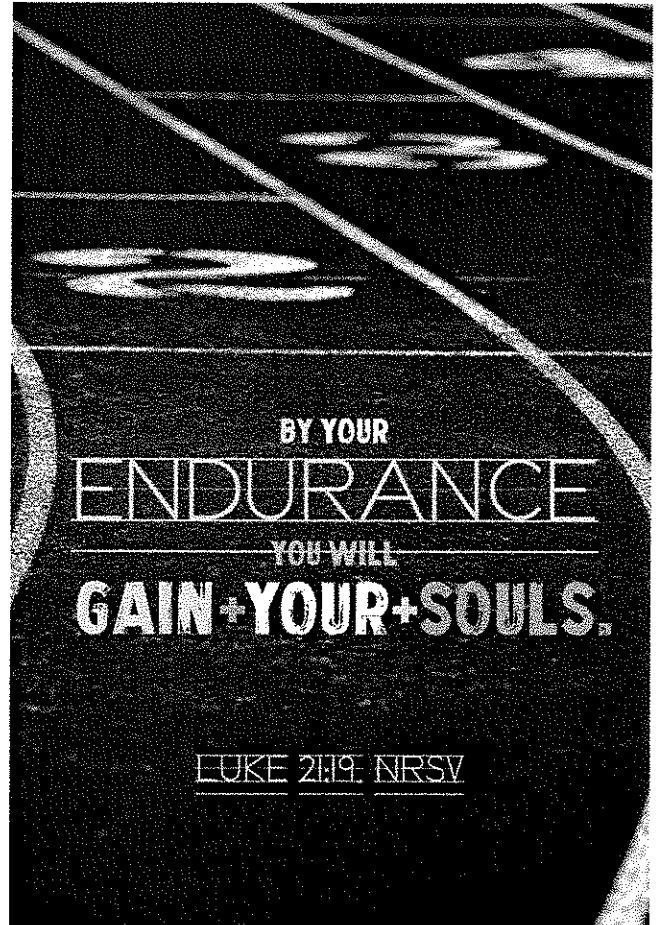
## **PARISH MEMBERSHIP**

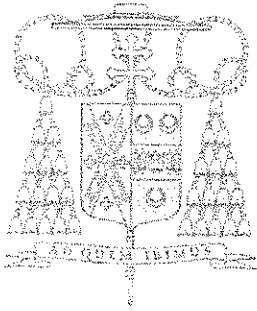

Dear friends in the Lord:

Thanksgiving is the time of the year when we, as individuals, families, a nation, and faith communities come together to give thanks to the Lord for the many blessings He has given us. It is also the time when we look to give something back to those in need. For over a century, Catholic Charities has been serving all New Yorkers in need by providing a range of services that provide help and create hope for the most vulnerable among us, Catholics and non-Catholics alike.

Beginning in 2017 with the centennial of Catholic Charities, I was pleased to inaugurate the *Catholic Charities Campaign for Charity and Justice*. This is not a new collection. It is a replacement for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. It provides an important opportunity to reinforce the engaging acts of charity and justice being done in our own parishes which are so essential for living out our Catholic faith. A key feature is that a significant portion of the funds raised will provide a number of Seek grants to our parishes.
