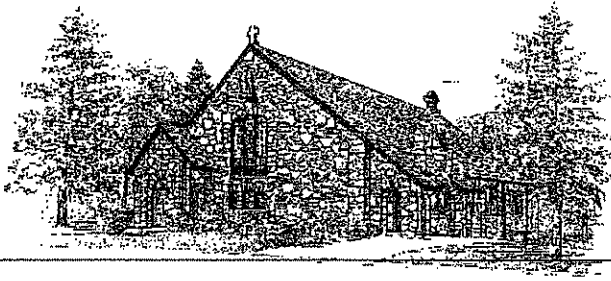

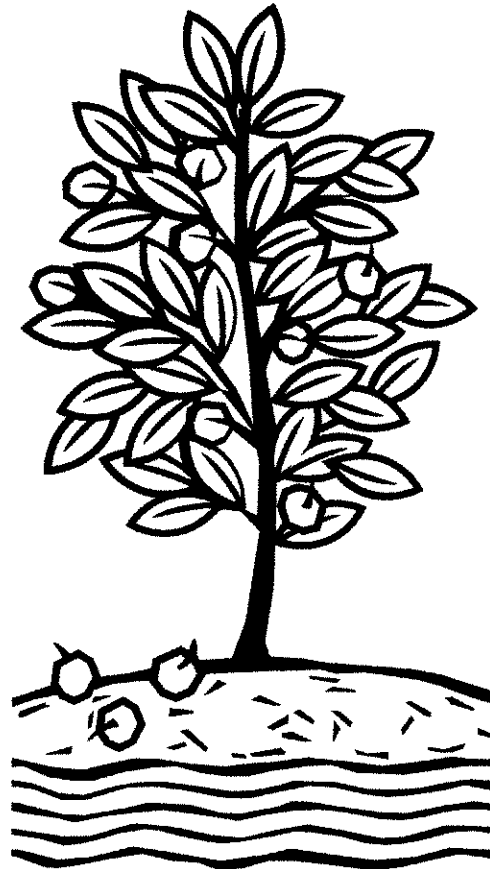
## **PARISH MEMBERSHIP**

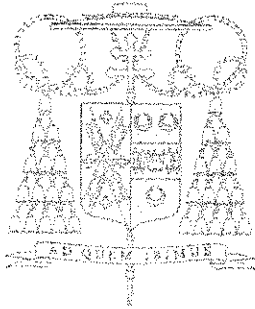
