Pastoral Council updates:

ST BRUNO: Starting to work on nominations for council, will have council presence at the welcome weekends in March and April. Developing the Stewardship Plan Fr. Dan has laid out.

ST PAUL:

-We will be serving as ushers, cantors and Eucharistic ministers at the 3/10 9am Mass

-A plan was presented for the Common Meeting Night to be called Semi-Annual Ministry Summit. The purpose of this event is to get all ministries "working toward a stewardship lifestyle, this summit will provide direct communication between all ministries, committees, Pastoral Council, Finance Council and the congregation at large; providing 1) education on how ministries goals support the mission statement of the parish, and 2) enthusiasm toward establishing a community of disciples who seek communion in the church and the world". Held February and September each year on the 4th Monday of the month. First meeting will be March 25th starting at 6:30. Trustees to facilitate the first event. Ministry meetings can be held following the general meeting. The Secretary of the Pastoral Council was asked to take the minutes. Each ministry will have 10 minutes to review committee accomplishments, upcoming plans and needs. It was suggested that the leader ask committee members to stand and be recognized. Time allowed for the meeting is 1 hour and 30 minutes and the trustees will be the official timekeepers. A written guideline has been developed for ministries to follow. All committee and Council members are encouraged to attend.

- The nomination process for the new council members will begin the weekend of 3/9-10

Parish Mission: Mary Kral reminded us to continue to invite and promote. Lori reminded of the importance of personal invitations to our events!

New Position cross parish: Fr. Dan announced a new position called the Direction of Evangelization and Life Long Faith Formation. This person will lead the new Evangelization Commission and will work with the Faith Formation team to help "fill the gaps" between entrance into the church.
