

Calvary Cemetery, St. George – St. Francis

Planting & Decoration Regulations

1. On monument lots, only annual flowers may be planted at the head in a space equal to the length of the monument by 16 inches in width; or, if there is no monument, in a space equal to that which the monument would normally occupy. In no case may the bed of flowers exceed 16 inches in width. No trees, bushes or perennial plantings are allowed.
 2. Wooden, plastic, concrete or other similar receptacles containing plant material are not allowed.
 3. Potted plants in pots not exceeding 10 inches in diameter, artificial flowers and wreaths are permitted to be placed on lots 7 days prior to, but will be removed immediately after the 8th day following the days listed:

Palm Sunday	Labor Day	Easter Sunday	All Saints Day
Mother's Day	Veteran's Day	Father's Day	Thanksgiving Day
Memorial Day	Christmas Day	July 4th	Anniversary Day
 4. Cut Flowers are permitted when placed in an approved (recessed) metal container directly in front of the monument or in the space in which the monument would normally occupy.
 5. Fall/Winter decorations will be removed as soon after March 1st as the weather permits if Cemetery Maintenance personnel are unable to complete the task according to rule #3 above.
 6. Flags are permitted on graves only on Memorial Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day as agreed upon with the American Legion or VFW.
 7. Under no circumstances are glass, plastic, ceramic, metal, or otherwise breakable and/or dangerous objects permitted to be placed on or near grave sites.
 8. All objects shall be removed which violate the above regulations or, when in the judgment of the Cemetery Maintenance personnel, their appearance and condition warrant removal.
- Many people visit the cemetery each year. Because the cemetery is open to the public, it is impossible to control the activity of every visitor, but it is the duty of the Cemetery Committee along with the Parish Council to provide a safe and respectful Cemetery for all.
- No Work on monuments or graves is to be done without prior permission from the Parish Office.

Come and Have Breakfast

The theme of light and darkness in John's Gospel is strong. In today's reading, we hear that it was 'just after daybreak' when Jesus appeared to the disciples. The disciples had been fishing all night but caught nothing. Then, with the dawn, Jesus appears on the beach and gently suggests that they cast the nets on the other side of the boat. We are invited to reflect on resurrection here, moments where we were given a sense of new life, and with that, an abundance of gifts. Perhaps a friendship had broken down or we were dealing with a crisis. Like the disciples, we may have simply been going through the motions of day to day life, in the dark, without much enthusiasm. And then... daybreak. A gentle voice guided us, a friend or in a moment of prayer. In time, we realized that this was Jesus' voice pointing us in the right direction, and once we allowed ourselves to be guided by Him, the 'catch' was huge.

The end of the passage sees Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves him. Peter is once again by a charcoal fire so this scene mirrors the three denials of Peter during the trial of Jesus. Peter becomes upset, and one can understand the regrets he must have. Yet here, Jesus is giving Peter the space to undo his denials. There is healing, new life. We can imagine Jesus' question to Peter at the end of the passage being addressed to us: 'Simon, son of John, do you love me?... Tend my sheep!' Place yourself in this story throughout the week.

Many ask how the Church is paying for programs and settlements in response to the sex abuse scandals. In light of the most recent crisis, Cardinal Dolan has been outspoken in helping others find healing and receive answers in this challenging time. His Eminence has clarified that charitable donations will not be used to fund the Reconciliation and Compensation Program, saying, "Please know that **no gifts** to the *Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal* or the *Renew + Rebuild* campaign are being used to fund the program." The archdiocese has borrowed money against the land it owns under the Palace Hotel, and will repay the loan with the sale of other property over time through other real estate holdings.
