

Calvary Cemetery, St. George – St. Francis

Planting & Decoration Regulations

1. On monument lots, only **annual flowers** may be planted at the head in a space equal to the length of the monument by 16 inches in width; or, if there is no monument, in a space equal to that which the monument would normally occupy. In no case may the bed of flowers exceed 16 inches in width. No **trees, bushes or perennial** plantings are allowed.
 2. Wooden, plastic, concrete or other similar receptacles containing plant material are not allowed.
 3. Potted plants in pots not exceeding 10 inches in diameter, artificial flowers and wreaths are permitted to be placed on lots 7 days prior to, but will be removed immediately after the 8th day following the days listed:

Palm Sunday	Labor Day	Easter Sunday	All Saints Day
Mother's Day	Veteran's Day	Father's Day	Thanksgiving Day
Memorial Day	Christmas Day	July 4th	Anniversary Day
 4. Cut Flowers are permitted when placed in an approved (recessed) metal container directly in front of the monument or in the space in which the monument would normally occupy.
 5. Fall/Winter decorations will be removed as soon after March 1st as the weather permits if Cemetery Maintenance personnel are unable to complete the task according to rule #3 above.
 6. Flags are permitted on graves only on Memorial Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day as agreed upon with the American Legion or VFW.
 7. Under no circumstances are glass, plastic, ceramic, metal, or otherwise breakable and/or dangerous objects permitted to be placed on or near grave sites.
 8. All objects shall be removed which violate the above regulations or, when in the judgment of the Cemetery Maintenance personnel, their appearance and condition warrant removal.
- Many people visit the cemetery each year. Because the cemetery is open to the public, it is impossible to control the activity of every visitor, but it is the duty of the Cemetery Committee along with the Parish Council to provide a safe and respectful Cemetery for all.
- No Work on monuments or graves is to be done without prior permission from the Parish Office.

Confessions - Thirty minutes before weekend Masses.

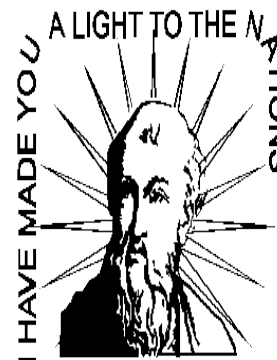
Pastoral Visitations

I Know Them

John's Gospel is sometimes referred to as the 'spiritual Gospel,' as it has beautiful, reflective passages. During the Easter season, we read and hear mostly from John. It is a lovely opportunity to meditate more deeply on the Word. Today, we are given the image of Jesus as the Shepherd and of his people as the flock. We hear the words 'I know them.' Jesus knows each person intimately. He knows our deepest desires, our worries and fears, our insecurities and pain. Jesus is as close to us as our own breathing. Nobody can interfere with this intimate friendship, even though at times we may feel differently. We may experience discrimination because of our faith, or be attacked in some way. When things are not going so well, we may feel as if Jesus has abandoned us; sometimes we simply want to give up on the whole thing. We become distant. Let this passage be a reminder to us that Jesus is always very close to us and knows our struggles. We simply need to share those struggles and fears with Him, for 'no one will snatch them [you] out of my hand.' We may forget this from time to time. This week, can you spend five minutes each day meditating on this passage? Focus on the breath. A phrase to repeat might be: 'Jesus, I know that you are as close to me as my own breathing.'
