Our CCW ladies have been busy collecting plastic caps for Caps of Love. I spoke to Valerie recently and she was overjoyed at the response she has gotten on these caps. At the time I was dropping mine off, she pointed to a lady who had driven all the way from Jacksonville with a car load of caps that she had collected from friends, neighbors and co-workers. Valerie said they were able to provide money recently for two wheelchairs and a service dog.

This month we are collecting long sleeve shirts for the migrants.

I have made numerous trips to St. Ann Place to drop off toiletries and towels for the homeless which the ladies have collected from various sources. I recently had my teeth cleaned and explained to my dental hygienist about the program and she gave me a handful of toothbrushes, dental floss and toothpaste. So don't be afraid to approach your dental hygienist for handouts. They are more than glad to do it. And save those toiletries you don't use when traveling. They are the perfect size for providing to the homeless. St. Ann Place just finished a renovation a few months ago and they said they are always in need of toiletries as they now have six separate showers for those desiring to take a shower and shave, etc. They have a wonderful large kitchen where sandwiches and snacks are prepared by volunteers. Each man or woman gets a brown lunch bag with sandwiches, cookie, and fruit. St. Ann Place is located at 2011 N. Dixie Highway and they are always looking for volunteers.

We have collected baby items for Holy Ground shelter and I have dropped them off. They help pregnant ladies who have chosen birth rather than abortion. Right now they have six young ladies in their program providing support through mentoring and financial support to get them on their feet and

make them self-supporting. The young ladies are required to get their GED's, get a job and pay their bills where possible. The main office is located at 200 W 20th Street, Riviera Beach, FL.

We have had representatives from the Guardian Ad Litem program visit our meetings to explain what they do and how they need help. Also a representative from Gratitude House came to our meeting to explain how their program works for the rehabilitation of pregnant women so they can raise their babies/children.

I plan to introduce a new charity at OLQA next meeting regarding homeless Veterans. There is a wonderful organization in Palm Springs, called Faith, Hope Love Charity, Inc. or a/k/a "STAND DOWN HOUSE. They are a **"Veteran's Resource organization and offer supportive services to assist the homeless and at-risk veterans and their families."** The Executive Director, Roy Foster, was featured on CNN Heroes 3-4 years ago and won the award for most outstanding charity. I have been involved with them ever since. I just dropped off \$500 in new underwear for men, gift cards for the ladies, along with towels and wash cloths that another club I belong to purchased for them from money raised at flea markets and selling raffle tickets. They are right now in the process of building a **Village of Valor gated community** that will house approximately 160 men, women and families. It will be located right here in Palm Beach County. I have brochures regarding this organization for anyone interested.

We are committed to helping the homeless and continue to do whatever we can on their behalf.

Good Morning! Happy Spring to all! Green is the color of March, of nature, life, saving the plant, good fortune and don't forget St. Patrick's Day.

As I reflect on my trip to Tallahassee, a great time was had by all. I encourage my council sisters to attend next year's Days at the Capitol in February.

The Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops issued four bills which we discussed with our legislators.

The four bills were:

- Kidcare Expansion for Lawfully Residing Immigrant Children
- Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) Education Program (I believe this was passed while we were there)
- Reflection Period before Abortion
- Unanimous Jury Recommendation for Capital Sentencing

These bills have been before the House and Senate for several years. But, as one part passes, the other doesn't. Therefore, we continue to persevere. As in the bill for Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program finally passed.

Support legislation that protects life, the dignity of work, the rights of workers and the basic necessities that provide quality of life, food, shelter, healthcare, education and employment.

Remember to pray the rosary for all Christians that are losing their life, due to their faith and the Jewish people as they are an integral part of our faith.
