SACRAMENTS

Today Jesus tells us to love another. But what does he mean? Love is an overused word in our society. We use it for just about anything that gives us a good feeling. But for Jesus love took on a deeper meaning. Jesus did not feel so good on the cross, did he? But for him that was the greatest act of love! Love then is not a feeling, it's a virtue and act of the will. We choose to love even when it hurts, when it doesn't feel so good. We act upon love in communion with other people even when they don't love us back. Love takes the greatest of all sacrifices. Jesus taught us true love when he laid down his life for our sake so that we may share in the very divine life of God! As Mother St. Theresa of Kolkata said, "Love, to be real, must cost. It must hurt. It must empty us of self."

Do you want to know what love is? Gaze at a crucifix. That's not how the world loves; it's how God does!

From the Baltimore Catechism.

Lesson 1: The Purpose of Man's Existence

- 1) **Who made us?** God made us.
In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, (Genesis 1:1)
- 2) **Who is God?** God is the Supreme Being, infinitely perfect, who made all things and keeps them in existence.
'In him we live and move and have our being'; (Acts 17:28)
- 3) **Why did God make us?** God made us to show forth His goodness and to share with us His everlasting happiness in heaven.
"What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him"— (I Corinthians 2:9)
- 4) **What must we do to gain the happiness of heaven?** To gain the happiness of heaven we must know, love, and serve God in this world.
"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and

steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. (Matthew 6:19-20)

- 5) **From whom do we learn to know, love, and serve God?** We learn to know, love, and serve God from Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who teaches us through the Catholic Church.
I have come as light into the world, so that everyone who believes in me should not remain in the darkness. (John 12:46)
- 6) **Where do we find the chief truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church?** We find the chief truths taught by Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church in the Apostles' Creed
"Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me." (Luke 10:16)

7) Say the Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.
