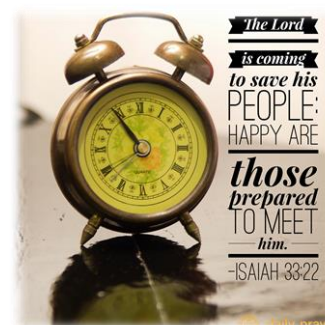

UPDATED GUIDANCE FOR WEDDINGS AND FUNERALS (FROM THE DIOCESE): "Earlier this week Washington State Gov. Jay Inslee issued updated guidance for weddings and funerals in the state. The primary change is that in counties which have reached Phase 3 of the state's COVID-19 reopening plan, attendance at weddings and funerals is increased to 50 participants or 25% of maximum building capacity, whichever is less. The personnel needed to celebrate the wedding or funeral... are not counted within the limit. In Modified Phase 1 and **Phase 2 counties, the participant limit remains 30 people**, or 25% of maximum building capacity, whichever is less.... Please note also that the attendance limit is the same whether services are indoors or outdoors.

Two further things to note: first, the Washington State Legislature has approved, through its leadership, the extension of the proclamations issued by the governor until November 9. This guidance, as well as guidance for religious services, is enforceable by law. It is the policy of the Diocese of Yakima to follow our county, state and federal laws, even as we occasional advocate to change those laws when necessary."

A FRIENDLY REMINDER..... As we get back into our routine of coming to Mass, it is easy to unintentionally become careless when it comes to following the rules for re-opening the church. We are still required to wear masks and social distance for Mass and all indoor activities. There is red tape on the pews as a reminder to sit 6 feet from the next family. If you forgot your mask, there are some in the narthex. No one wants to see us have to close our doors again. Signing up for Mass, especially the Spanish Mass, is important to keep our numbers within the allowed capacity of 75. In all fairness, those who sign up ahead of time should be the first allowed in the church to ensure they have a place to sit. If you need help, call Alejandra 398-4885, the rectory, or Mary. Dressing for the Feast: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time...

Our Lord's parable in today's Gospel is again a fairly straightforward outline of salvation history. God is the king (see [Matthew 5:35](#)), Jesus the bridegroom (see [Matthew 9:15](#)), the feast is the salvation and eternal life that Isaiah prophesies in today's First Reading. The Israelites are those first invited to the feast by God's servants, the prophets (see [Isaiah 7:25](#)). For refusing repeated invitations and even killing His prophets, Israel has been punished, its city conquered by foreign armies. Now, Jesus makes clear, God is sending new servants, His apostles, to call not only Israelites, but all people—good and bad alike—to the feast of His kingdom. This an image of the Church, which Jesus elsewhere compares to a field sown with both wheat and weeds, and a fishing net that catches good fish and bad (see [Matthew 13:24-43, 47-50](#)).

We have all been called to this great feast of love in the Church, where, as Isaiah foretold, the veil that once separated the nations from the covenants of Israel has been destroyed, where the dividing wall of enmity has been torn down by the blood of Christ (see [Ephesians 2:11-14](#)). As we sing in today's Psalm, the Lord has led us to this feast, refreshing our souls in the waters of Baptism, spreading the table before us in the Eucharist. As Paul tells us in today's Epistle, in the glorious riches of Christ, we will find supplied whatever we need. And in the rich food of His body, and the choice wine of His blood, we have a foretaste of the eternal banquet in the heavenly Jerusalem, when God will destroy death forever (see [Hebrews 12:22-24](#)). But are we dressed for the feast, clothed in the garment of righteousness (see [Revelation 19:8](#))? Not all who have been called will be chosen for eternal life, Jesus warns. Let us be sure that we're living in a manner worthy of the invitation we've received (see [Ephesians 4:1](#)).

Sacraments during the COVID-19 pandemic:

- † Baptism: Contact the parish office to arrange for baptism. Fr. Mario is doing up to 3 each Sunday after the Spanish Mass.
- † Sacrament of Reconciliation: None at this time, in accordance with the decree from the Bishop during the pandemic - "Priests serving in the Diocese of Yakima over the age of 60 should not celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation with individual parishioners."
- † Anointing of the Sick: Contact the parish office
- † Weddings and Quinceaneras: Make arrangements with Fr. Mario. All events must follow the pandemic guidelines. Capacity: 30
