### OLD BUSINESS:

- \* The rectory apartment is in the process of being fixed up and the bathroom remodeled

- \* The parish received a SBA PPP loan in the amount of \$19,900.00
- \* The council looked over a sample letter to send out welcoming people back to Mass. Pat will make changes on it. It had been suggested at the last meeting to reach out to people who were not yet attending.
- \* The tabernacle has been repaired and is back.
- \* The rectory roof needs to be caulked around the fascia. There is no need for a new roof.



### NEW BUSINESS:

- \* The fence around the outdoor unit needs to be stained. Cleora will talk to Debbie to see if the Confirmation students want to do it as a community service project.
- \* Jim asked how our weekly contributions were doing. They are down, but the exact amount was not available at the meeting. Online giving is going well. Joan and Pat spoke in favor of it and commented on how convenient it was for them.
- \* The parking lot will be resealed.

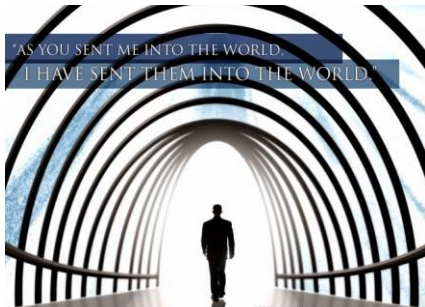


**SCOTT HAHN'S REFLECTION....** God is love, and He revealed that love in sending His only Son to be a sacrificial offering for our sins.

In these words from today's Epistle, we should hear an echo of the story of Abraham's offering of Isaac at the dawn of salvation history. Because Abraham obeyed God's command and did not withhold his only beloved son, God promised that Abraham's descendants, the children of Israel, would be the source of blessing for all nations (see [Genesis 22:16–18](#)).

We see that promise coming to fulfillment in today's First Reading. God pours out His Spirit upon the Gentiles, the non-Israelites, as they listen to the word of Peter's preaching. Notice they receive the same gifts received by the devout Jews who heard Peter's preaching at Pentecost—the Spirit comes to rest upon them and they speak in tongues, glorifying God (see [Acts 2:5–11](#)).

In His love today, God reveals that His salvation embraces the house of Israel and peoples of all nations. Not by circumcision or blood relation to Abraham but by faith in the Word of Christ, sealed in the Sacrament of Baptism, people are to be made children of Abraham, heirs to God's covenants of promise (see [Galatians 3:7–9](#); [Ephesians 2:12](#)).



This is the wondrous work of God that we sing of in today's Psalm. It is the work of the Church, the good fruit that Jesus chooses and appoints His Apostles for in today's Gospel. As Peter raises up Cornelius today, the Church continues to lift all eyes to Christ, the only one in whose name they can find salvation.

In the Church, each of us has been begotten by the love of God. But the Scriptures today reveal that this divine gift brings with it a command and a duty. We are to love one another as we have been loved. We are to lay down our lives in giving ourselves to others—that they too might find friendship with Christ and new life through Him.

## **PRAYER TO ST. JOSEPH**

To you, O blessed Joseph, do we come in our tribulation,  
and having implored the help of your most holy Spouse,  
we confidently invoke your patronage also.

Through that charity which bound you to the  
Immaculate Virgin Mother of God and through the paternal love with which you embraced the Child  
Jesus,  
we humbly beg you graciously to regard the inheritance  
which Jesus Christ has purchased by his Blood,  
and with your power and strength to aid us in our necessities.

O most watchful guardian of the Holy Family,

O our most mighty protector, be kind to us and from heaven  
assist us in our struggle with the power of darkness.

As once you rescued the Child Jesus from deadly peril,

one of us by your constant protection,  
so that, supported by your example and your aid,  
we may be able to live piously, to die in holiness,  
and to obtain eternal happiness in heaven. Amen.
