Cathedral Restoration Update (as of February 5, 2020)

Dear Parishioners,

Since the end of June last year, we have been back in the Cathedral church for all of our Masses, Sacraments, and other liturgical celebrations. Many people have come to appreciate and marvel at the beauty of the sacred art (the painting, the stenciling, the apse mural, etc.) and other aspects of the interior restoration done inside the church. Meanwhile, work on the drainage around the church and in the sacristies continued. Lately, some people have asked me why the man lifts and scaffolding are back in some areas around the church. What work are they still doing in regard to the Cathedral restoration? So, I thought about giving you an update.

Windows - Stephen Frei and his crew from Emil Frei & Associates are back to finish up the work on the Cathedral windows. They are running new framing on the rest of the Nave windows (5) and installing hurricane protective tempered glass. They are replacing the old rusted and deteriorated steel frames in the bell tower and installing new aluminum frames with provisions for future stained glass and installing new hurricane protective tempered glass in all 30 openings. They are finishing the stained glass repair in the 4 terra-cotta windows and will be installing hurricane protective glass in those also. And they will be installing hurricane protective glass in the 2 smaller sacristy windows. The total number of individual plates will be 94.

Sacristies – The upper sacristy is almost complete and now functional. In fact, we moved the essential sacristy items (for use in our daily liturgies) before the New Year, and started using it the beginning of the year. There are a few minor things left to do, like putting the wood door and moulding around the lift, and installing the locks on certain cabinets. The lift has been installed. The construction of the exterior exit to the lower sacristy is almost complete. Work in the lower sacristy continues. The powder room and the vaults have been constructed. They are now installing the casework, which will soon be ready for finishing.

Electricals – The light control panels, sound and broadcasting panels, security and electrical in general are now permanently activated in the lower sacristy, with control panels in the upper sacristy for ease of use by the sacristans and the clergy. The different light settings have been programmed. There are a few other things left to tie loose ends.

Sound System – All remaining speakers (for monitoring) have been installed (in the sacristy, choir loft, altar area, and Baptistery/cry room). Interface for broadcasting of the Mass was installed. The choir loft microphones are now fully functional. The touch screen for sound adjustments is now installed in choir loft. The pulpit microphone (which was damaged during the removal and storage) has been replaced and the wiring issue resolved. All wireless microphones are now fully functional (3 lapels and one handheld). Lector and pulpit adjustments on touch screen now work properly (were swapped). Here's what left to do: Final tuning for better clarity with less echo/reverb, and minor cosmetic adjustments to touch screens (larger fonts, etc.).

Drainage – Ribbeck Construction is installing French drains around the church to keep the water away from the building. A concrete retaining wall was installed 4' out from the exterior wall, along the east, south, southwest, and northwest walls of the church (work just started along the north side of the church). The drainage basin where the French drain and storm drain pipes exist were filled with river gravel. The diversion of the water from the roofs and surrounding area will prevent uneven settlement of the Cathedral and protect the soils that support the existing foundations. After the French drain lines and downspout drain lines are set, a main drainage trunk line will be installed along the north brick fence to be tied into the underground storm drainage system.

Brick & Mortar – Workers from Ribbeck Construction are cleaning the masonry walls of the Cathedral and replacing cracked and deteriorated old historic mortar at the masonry joints; the work has begun on the east side and the southwest sides of the Cathedral. To prevent concrete from splashing on newly cleaned masonry when the perimeter concrete retaining walls were being formed and poured, the masonry cleaning and pointing process was intentionally scheduled last to allow for construction of the storm drainage system around the Cathedral. Part of the cleaning procedure will also include the removal of the white glaze/stain that currently can be seen on the exterior of the church walls. This white stain is due to a sealant that was applied in the 80's by a company that is now out of business and the removal of this sealant currently takes a substantial amount of labor. As Ribbeck described in the reports, the historical restoration guidelines prohibit sealers from being applied. Pointing of masonry mainly involves removing cracked/damaged mortar from affected masonry joints and applying new custom factory mixed mortar to affected joints to protect the exterior envelope of masonry walls. The process of cleaning and pointing the mortar on the masonry walls at the Cathedral involves setting up scaffolds to be able to reach to the top of the walls; and also setting up protective dunnage on the lower roofs to allow for workers to clean and repair affected masonry joints on the walls above the lower roofs; while walking on the protected clay tile roof. Unfortunately, due to the amount of years of exposure to the elements and in part due to the application of the sealant on the masonry walls in the 80's, the mortar in the mortar joints is substantially deteriorated and the labor to repair has been considerable. They will continue to restore the masonry joints in the following weeks until completion.

I would like to thank Stephen Frei and Guy Pondrom from Emil Frei & Associates, Buzzy Ribbeck and Camilo Garcia from Ribbeck Construction, and John Pellerin (who coordinates with Porche' Advanced Systems) for helping me put together this latest update on the Cathedral restoration. May the good work the Lord has begun in us be brought to completion!
