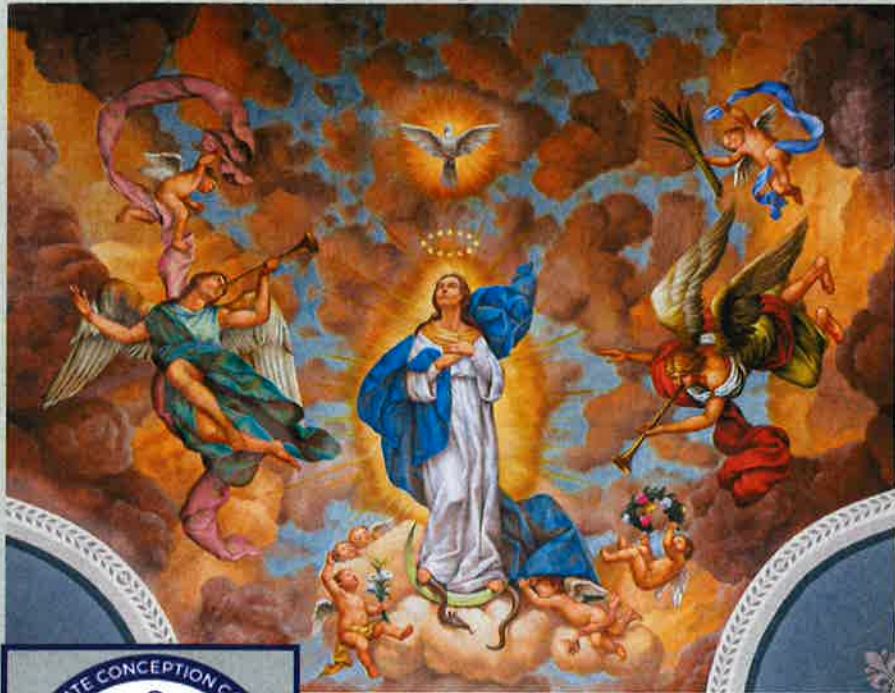

**SOLEMNITY MARKS ANNIVERSARY
OF CATHEDRAL DEDICATION**

The Most Reverend Glen John Provost, Bishop of Lake Charles, celebrated the second anniversary of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception's dedication at the 12:05 p.m. Mass on Tuesday, August 31. The anniversary is a Solemnity for the Cathedral parish following the Rite of Dedication in 2019 after the historic restoration of the 108-year-old church.

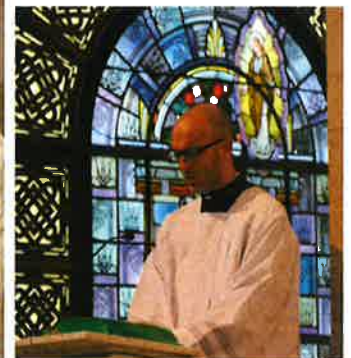
Joining Bishop Provost were the Very Reverend Rommel Tolentino, pastor, and Reverend Samuel Bond, parochial vicar, both of Immaculate Conception Parish. Assisting as altar servers were Joshua Page and Treville Belcher, both seminarians for the Diocese of Lake Charles at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans.

"It is here in the Cathedral that God dwells in the Blessed Sacrament," said Bishop Provost. "Here in this house, the needy and troubled come to pray. Within these walls, sins are forgiven; new life is baptized; man and woman are joined in marriage; and the deceased are laid to rest. And most important of all, the Sacrifice of Calvary is made present to us, the faithful."

Dating back more than a century, the existing structure of the Cathedral was dedicated for the first time in 1913. The extensive restoration project was made possible through the "Return to the Lord" capital campaign to ensure the longevity of the church for future generations.

"The creation of more than a century ago remains intact, and God remains present to His people," Bishop Provost continued. "The Church is a profession of faith, a profession of faith in the one God who gives meaning so that no labor will be in vain."

The anniversary of the dedication is to be celebrated each year on August 31 with the rank of Solemnity in the Cathedral itself and the rank of Feast in other churches in the Diocese of Lake Charles.

Rosary Around the Lake ~ Oct. 3

The fourth annual Rosary Around the Lake, organized by the Ruth Institute, will take place Sunday, October 3, beginning at 2 p.m. at the Lake Charles Civic Center. The event is part of Rosary Coast to Coast taking place the following Sunday, Oct. 10, across the nation.

Locally, participants will meet in the area on the west side of the Civic Center and organize in groups of 11 to form a "Living Rosary." The organizer of each group will wear a gold shirt representing the "Lord's Prayer," with the team's other 10 members in blue shirts representing the 10 "Hail Mary" beads. Anyone is welcome to attend either individually, with their family or a small group, or by organizing a "decade" of 10 people.

The deadline to pre-order T-shirts is Sunday, September 5, at midnight. Although you do not need to order a shirt to participate, they will help to make the "Living Rosary" more visible. T-shirts from Rosary Around the Lake in previous years, or shirts in McNeese University colors will serve the same purpose.

Arrival at 1 p.m. will allow time to register unless you have pre-registered on-line. Those individuals and teams can arrive at 1:30 p.m. to begin lining up for the rosary. The Ruth Institute has sponsored Rosary Around the Lake in Lake Charles since 2018 as a way of praying for salvation and renewal for our world, our culture, our nation, our neighbors, and ourselves.
