MEDITATION

Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

This is my body.

Wouldn't it be great if you could just pick up the phone and call God and ask him anything you want? Not to ask him to give you gifts, but to ask him for answers to the mysteries of life. Maybe you could ask why there is suffering in the world. Maybe you would ask something silly, like why there are fleas or whether the chicken or the egg came first. Or maybe you would want to know the secret to a peaceful life. Wouldn't you love to ask God?

Well, you can—but not with a phone call. Today, we celebrate the fact that Jesus has made himself—body, blood, soul, and divinity—available to us in the form of bread and wine. In the Eucharist, he is always with us, “until the end of the age.” No matter where we go, he is with us: in towering cathedrals or run-down prisons, in ornate golden chalices and in the palms of sinners' hands.

From the time of the Last Supper until today, Jesus “disdains no dwelling, but consents to come like a guest to any heart, even one that is defiled.” He comes to transform us just as the Host is transformed: not in outward appearance but in our inner lives.

No, you can't call God on the phone, but you can visit him in person. Just to sit in Jesus' presence with a quieted heart can do wonders. There, in the still of adoration, he may give you a sense of peace or whisper a new thought, insight, or idea to your heart.

Will you go to Him? Even if you can spend only five minutes, it is worth it. That is five minutes with your King. So go, he is waiting just for you.
