Sept. 10, 2015 at 7PM at St. Mary of the Snow Church. Taize Services last for approximately 45 minutes, and are held in candlelight. A choir of two dozen singers sing several simple 8 measure chants, and repeat each one for several minutes, with harmonies added throughout. The services are very calming and soothing, and allow listeners an opportunity to connect with God in a special and prayerful way. The services are named after the religious community that writes the chants, Taize, France.
- The Saint Mary of the Snow-St. Joseph Music Ministry will present a "Music Variety Show" Friday-Sunday, October 2-4, 2015. The show will be held at the St. Mary of the Snow Hall.
