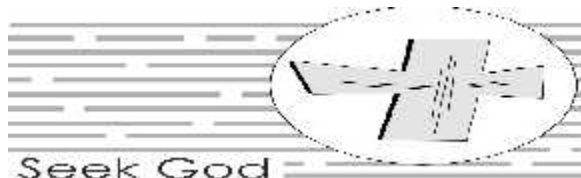

REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL

Hoy, en el Evangelio, el Señor revela a sus discípulos las dificultades que encontrará entre las autoridades, religiosas y políticas, de su pueblo. Éstos lo harán apresar y lo condenarán a muerte.

Pedro se niega a aceptar lo dicho por Jesús, no está dispuesto a pagar ese precio por seguirlo. Su práctica no está de acuerdo con su teoría. Reconoce en Jesús al Mesías pero le choca el anuncio del Mesías. El Señor le responde con fuerza. Nuestra traducción pone en labios de Jesús la frase "¡Apártate de mí, Satanás!"; pero lo que literalmente dice Jesús es "¡ponte detrás de mí, Satanás!". Con ello Jesús le dice a Pedro que tome su puesto de discípulo, puesto que lo llama a situarse detrás de él para seguirlo y no ser un obstáculo en su camino.

El Señor sabe que ser discípulo implica un proceso. Se aprende a ser coherente, a no afirmar una cosa y hacer otra. No es sencillo poner en práctica el Evangelio, pero hay que hacerlo, esto se demuestra en nuestras obras.

Seguir a Jesús, dejarse seducir por Dios hoy, como dice Jeremías en la primera lectura, debe llevarnos a hablar claro y a no quedarnos en paliativos. No se trata de crear problemas, sino de reconocer su presencia y luchar por resolverlos. A muchos no les gustará que se hable y se actúe así. Tendremos la tentación de callar o de evitarnos dificultades como Pedro. Pero el Señor espera siempre que sepamos discernir su voluntad, como pide san Pablo en la segunda lectura, y que no separemos el amor de Dios del amor al prójimo y que retomemos constantemente a nuestro lugar de discípulos. Amén.
