REFLEXIÓN DOMINICAL

En este tiempo de Pascua, los evangelios nos van mostrando las visitas de Jesús como un medio para confirmarlos en la fe y despertarlos a sus nuevas responsabilidades.

El Evangelio de este domingo nos muestra cómo Jesús es reconocido al partir el pan. Luego se presenta en medio de sus seguidores y les desea la paz. Sabemos de la riqueza de esa noción, ella implica plenitud de la vida. Jesús la anunció cuando caminaba con ellos por las calles de Galilea, ahora les confirma ese mensaje. Les muestra sus manos y sus pies: no es un espíritu, un fantasma. El resucitado tiene carne y huesos, tiene hambre y les pide algo para comer como siempre hizo con ellos. Lo come delante de ellos. La comida es signo de vida y de comunión.

El Señor les repite lo que les había dicho, ahora lo comprenden mejor, sus inteligencias se abren a las Escrituras. Ahora ven con claridad que su tarea es ser testigos del mensaje y de la Resurrección del Señor “comenzando por Jerusalén”, la ciudad en que fue ejecutado. Desde allí se proclamará la victoria sobre la muerte.

En la primera lectura, Pedro, fortalecido por el Espíritu, da testimonio de “estas cosas”. Los adversarios de Jesús tuvieron que optar entre “un asesino” y el “autor de la vida”. En varias oportunidades la Biblia nos dice que es necesario elegir entre la muerte y la vida. Eso es lo que hicieron los jefes del pueblo judío. El anuncio de Jesús ponía en entredicho sus privilegios, su respuesta fue decidir contra aquel que trae la vida en plenitud. Gesto inútil, al que ellos mataron Dios lo resucitó, Pedro da testimonio de eso. Toda defensa de un privilegio lleva a un comportamiento de muerte.

Una forma sutil de optar por la muerte es la doblez, la deslealtad para con lo que decimos creer. Aquel que no pone en práctica lo que afirma es “un mentiroso y la verdad no está con él”. Creer en el resucitado es afirmar la vida y comunicarla, si no compartimos la vida, la plenitud del amor de Dios no está en nosotros. Dar vida implica muchas cosas, sin descuidar algo aparentemente muy sencillo, que el propio resucitado reclamó: dar de comer. Ojalá tuviéramos siempre “pescado asado” para compartir. Amén.

In the breaking of the bread
