UNA FRESCA PERSPECTIVA DE LAS LECTURAS DOMINICALES

SU PALABRA HOY *por el Reverendo William J. Reilly*

Cuarto Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario
3 de febrero de 2019

“Al oír estas palabras, todos los que estaban en la sinagoga se enfurecieron y, levantándose, lo empujaron fuera de la ciudad, hasta un lugar escarpado de la colina sobre la que se levantaba la ciudad, con intención de despeñarlo. Pero Jesús, pasando en medio de ellos, continuó su camino... Ellos combatirán contra ti, pero no te derrotarán, porque yo estoy contigo para librarte –palabra del Señor.”

El llamado del profeta Jeremías y el de la voz profética de Jesús pueden ser una fuente de consuelo, así como de preocupación. Un profeta es a veces descrito como aquel que acomoda al preocupado y preocupa al cómodo. Sin duda, la misión del profeta del Antiguo Testamento y el reto de Jesús puede ya causar ansiedad o producir calma, pero El está con nosotros para librarnos.

La palabra de Dios está diseñada para ayudarnos a discernir cómo podemos crecer en nuestras vidas cristianas, para conocer mejor al Señor, para amarlo aún en las circunstancias más extremas, y para servirlo ayudando a los más vulnerables y marginalizados.

No necesitamos ir lejos para descubrir dónde podemos poner este reto en acción. Admiramos tanto a aquellos que dan de sí mismos para el beneficio de otros. Recuerde al rico admirador de una Misionera de Caridad quien dijo que ni por un millón de dólares cambiaría el vendaje de un leproso. La Hermana le respondió: ‘Yo tampoco lo haría por un millón de dólares. Pero con gusto lo haría por Jesús.’
