**LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

During the season of Lent, the church urges the  
faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives  
through performing acts of fast and abstinence.  
Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6 and ends on  
Holy Thursday, April 18.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast  
and abstinence. This is a serious matter within Church  
law.

Fasting means only one full meal a day may be taken. Two  
smaller meals can be eaten to maintain physical strength  
but together they should not equal another full meal in  
quantity. Snacking between meals is not permitted.

Catholics ages 18-59 are obliged to fast on Ash  
Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are not  
specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the  
discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.

Abstinence forbids the eating of meat or poultry.  
Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged to  
abstain on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent and  
continues to oblige throughout their lives. Those who are  
not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are  
encouraged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the  
extent that they are able.

Remember all Fridays of the year are designated  
as days of penance during which we are encouraged to  
practice self-denial out of gratitude for the suffering and  
death Jesus accepted for us.

The time for fulfilling your Easter Duty extends  
from the First Sunday of Lent (March 10) to Holy Trinity  
Sunday (June 16).

Our Cardinal's Appeal goal is \$87,000.00

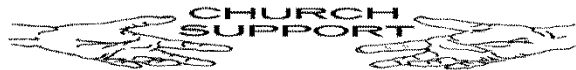
To date we have raised \$20,487.50

### **UNA FRESCA PERSPECTIVA DE LAS LECTURAS DOMINICALES**

**SU PALABRA HOY** *por el Reverendo William J. Reilly*  
**Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma**  
**31 de marzo de 2019**

**“El que vive en Cristo es una nueva criatura: lo antiguo ha desaparecido, un ser nuevo se ha hecho presente. Y todo esto procede de Dios, que nos reconcilió con él por intermedio de Cristo y nos confió el ministerio de la reconciliación. Porque es Dios el que estaba en Cristo, reconciliando al mundo consigo, no teniendo en cuenta los pecados de los hombres, y confiándonos la palabra de la reconciliación.”**

Miramos un mundo roto y acongojado, colmado de pobreza, guerra, odio y división. Y nos preguntamos: ¿Hay alguna forma de cambiar tanto sufrimiento y división?

Así como San Pablo les escribió a los corintios, nosotros podemos encontrar una solución, si reconocemos que Cristo vino a reconciliarnos con el Padre y al uno con el otro. Pero San Pablo también dice que se nos ha dado la gran responsabilidad de ser ministros de reconciliación. Ese ministerio es nuestro, de todos los que estamos unidos a Cristo. ¿Qué me detiene de intentar de suavizar la tensión, erradicar el odio, y llevar la paz de Cristo a otros? Eso estaba incluido en la bella oración de San Oscar Romero, recordándonos que debemos ser ministros de Cristo, embajadores de reconciliación, profetas de un futuro que no es nuestro.
