PARISHIONER GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO MASS:

- Please bring your own hand sanitizers to Mass. For your safety and the safety of our priests we ask that you sanitize your hands immediately before going up to Communion.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins to allow for seating.
- You may only enter through the Main doors of the church. **NO MASK-NO ENTRANCE!**
- Ushers will seat you – you may only sit in designated areas (designated by a blue X).
- There will be No Sign of Peace.
- Doors will be locked after the start of Mass – No late arrivals.

RECEIVING COMMUNION ONLY THE BODY OF CHRIST WILL BE DISTRIBUTED

- Please sanitize hands before receiving Communion.
- Communion will only be given out on the hand.
- Do not leave your pew until directed by an usher.
- Even if you are not receiving, you must get up and process with the line so no one has to climb over you to get in or out of the pew. Simply go up to the priest with your hands crossed over your chest for a blessing.
- After receiving the host in your hand, step to the X located 6 feet away from the priest, quickly lift your mask and consume the host – Return to your seat to pray.
- After the final dismissal, Father will proceed to the sacristy. **DO NOT** leave your seat until directed by an usher.
- No gatherings in the parking lot. Please head out as soon as you reach your car.

**PRENATAL**

We have started prenatal care as many women suffer so much curing child birth especially in the rural areas. The women will receive weekly instructions. We look forward to having our first baby delivered this fall

**WAITING LIST**

We have 110 patients on the waiting list for Cataract surgeries. The more surgeries performed the more patients come which makes additional patients to be on the waiting lists. Some of these patients have suffered from various eye ailments for more than seven years and up to ten years. They have living with their eye diseases as a result of financial difficulties. Now their eyes can be cared for in our Mission. Thank you for your generosity.

**NEEDS**

We graciously request your support to assist us in attending to the patients on the waiting list for CATARACT SURGERIES. It cost \$100.00 to perform one cataract surgery and \$20.00 to provide one month post-surgery care. There are 110 patients on the waiting list for Cataract surgeries and 20 patients on the waiting list for Herniorrhaphy and Hydrocelectomy. There are emergencies which constantly occur for Appendectomy which cost \$50.00 to perform. Deferring these surgeries for lack of funds can be very critical. We have a great need for over the counter drugs.

## UNA FRESCA PERSPECTIVA DE LAS LECTURAS DOMINICALES

**SU PALABRA HOY** *por el Reverendo William J. Reilly*

### Vigésimo Cuarto Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario 13 de septiembre de 2020

**“El rencor y la ira son abominables, y ambas cosas son patrimonio de pecador... Perdona el agravio a tu prójimo y entonces, cuando ores, serán absueltos tus pecados. Si un hombre mantiene su enojo contra otro, ¿cómo pretende que el Señor lo sane? No tiene piedad de un hombre semejante a él ¡y se atreve a implorar por sus pecados! El, un simple mortal, guarda rencor: ¿quién le perdonará sus pecados? Acuérdate del fin, y deja de odiar.”**

Para la mayoría es difícil perdonar. Para Dios, es la verdadera razón de la venida de Jesús, a perdonar y reconciliarnos con el Padre. A veces no nos fijamos en nuestras faltas y olvidamos pedir perdón. Otras veces vemos el daño que hemos causado y la necesidad de decir ‘Lo siento.’

Tómese un momento hoy y sea como San Pedro preguntando cuántas veces debemos perdonar a nuestro hermano – ¿siete o setenta veces? La respuesta no es un número, sino una actitud. Relea a Sirac y pregúntese si yo me aferro al rencor y la ira, si abrazo lo que me separa de mi prójimo, si fallo en reconocer el remordimiento de otra persona. Esté dispuesto a tomar el primer paso.
