As we begin the return to Daily and Sunday Mass, we have many guidelines and protocols that we must follow for everyone's safety. We ask for everyone's patience and understanding during this transition.

We will continue to Live Stream Mass until we are allowed to have 100% capacity. Remember the Sabbath obligation is still suspended, so if you are ill or at risk please stay home!

PARISHIONER GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO MASS:

You must wear a mask to church; you must wear your mask throughout the entire Mass.

- Please bring your own hand sanitizers to Mass. For your safety and the safety of our priests we ask that you sanitize your hands immediately before going up to Communion.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins to allow for seating.
- You may only enter through the Main doors of the church. **NO MASK-NO ENTRANCE!**
- Ushers will seat you – you may only sit in designated areas (designated by a blue X).
- There will be No Sign of Peace.
- Doors will be locked after the start of Mass – No late arrivals.

RECEIVING COMMUNION ONLY THE BODY OF CHRIST WILL BE DISTRIBUTED

- Please sanitize hands before receiving Communion.
- Communion will only be given out on the hand.
- Do not leave your pew until directed by an usher.
- Even if you are not receiving, you must get up and process with the line so no one has to climb over you to get in or out of the pew. Simply go up to the priest with your hands crossed over your chest for a blessing.
- After receiving the host in your hand, step to the X located 6 feet away from the priest, quickly lift your mask and consume the host – Return to your seat to pray.
- After the final dismissal, Father will proceed to the sacristy. **DO NOT** leave your seat until directed by an usher.
- No gatherings in the parking lot. Please head out as soon as you reach your car.

- Currently we can only have 100 people in the Church (30% capacity).
- We will need volunteers to clean and sanitize between Masses, so our schedule will be changing.

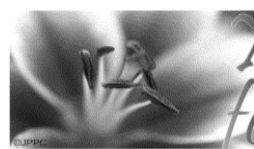

LECTURAS DOMINICALES

SU PALABRA HOY *por el Reverendo William J. Reilly*

Vigésimo Octavo Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario
11 de octubre de 2020

“Yo sé vivir tanto en las privaciones como en la abundancia... estoy hecho absolutamente a todo, a la saciedad como al hambre, a tener de sobra como a no tener nada. Yo lo puedo todo en aquel que me conforta. Sin embargo, ustedes hicieron bien en interesarse por mis necesidades. Dios colmará con magnificencia todas las necesidades de ustedes, conforme a su riqueza, en Cristo Jesús.”

La descripción de San Pablo sobre sí mismo y su vida es muy clara. Sus viajes, encarcelamientos, naufragios y encuentros con Cristo son bien conocidos. Pero enfoquémonos en la iglesia de hoy.

El rostro de Cristo está pintado de tantas maneras. Tenemos una relación cercana con Jesucristo. Somos bendecidos, con abundancia, quienes encontramos a Cristo en los pobres. Encontramos a personas que viven con miedo de enfermedad, indigencia, estado legal, quienes son los mismos hermanos y hermanas a quienes San Pablo dedicó su vida. ¿Qué podemos hacer para reflejar el rostro de Cristo a otros? ¿Qué pido para poder reconocer el rostro de Cristo en los más necesitado?

Mi mantra esta semana es: ‘Yo lo puedo todo en aquel que me conforta.’
