PARISHIONER GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO MASS:

You must wear a mask to church; you must wear your mask throughout the entire Mass.

- Please bring your own hand sanitizers to Mass. For your safety and the safety of our priests we ask that you sanitize your hands immediately before going up to Communion.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins to allow for seating.
- You may only enter through the Main doors of the church. **NO MASK-NO ENTRANCE!**
- Ushers will seat you – you may only sit in designated areas (designated by a blue X).
- There will be No Sign of Peace.
- Doors will be locked after the start of Mass – No late arrivals.

RECEIVING COMMUNION ONLY THE BODY OF CHRIST WILL BE DISTRIBUTED

- Please sanitize hands before receiving Communion.
- Communion will only be given out on the hand.
- Do not leave your pew until directed by an usher.
- Even if you are not receiving, you must get up and process with the line so no one has to climb over you to get in or out of the pew. Simply go up to the priest with your hands crossed over your chest for a blessing.
- After receiving the host in your hand, step to the X located 6 feet away from the priest, quickly lift your mask and consume the host – Return to your seat to pray.
- After the final dismissal, Father will proceed to the sacristy. **DO NOT** leave your seat until directed by an usher.
- No gatherings in the parking lot. Please head out as soon as you reach your car.

- Currently we can only have 100 people in the Church (30% capacity).

I thank you for all you do for this ministry. Father Mike and I are hoping to spread some Christmas cheer. In these times, we **NEED** it, I need it, we all need it. So although we will not meet as a committee, we are in spirit, together in this mission to bring our ministries Christmas kindness.

SU PALABRA HOY *por el Reverendo William J. Reilly*

Vigésimo Noveno Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario
18 de octubre de 2020

“Yo te llamé por tu nombre, te di un título insigne, sin que tú me conocieras. Yo soy el Señor, y no hay otro, no hay ningún Dios fuera de mí... Damos gracias a Dios por todos ustedes, cuando los recordamos en nuestras oraciones, y sin cesar tenemos presente cómo ustedes han manifestado su fe con obras, su amor con fatigas y su esperanza en nuestro Señor Jesucristo... Sabemos, hermanos amados por Dios, que ustedes han sido elegidos.”
