As we return to Daily and Sunday Mass, we have many guidelines and protocols that we must follow for everyone's safety.

We ask for everyone's patience and understanding during this time.

We will continue to Live Stream Mass until we are allowed to have 100% capacity. Remember the Sabbath obligation is still suspended, so if you are ill or at risk please stay home!

PARISHIONER GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO MASS:

You must wear a mask to church; you must wear your mask throughout the entire Mass.

- Please bring your own hand sanitizers to Mass.
- Sunday Mass attendance will be first come first serve. Currently we can only have 100 people in the Church (30% capacity)
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins to allow for seating.
- You may only enter through the Main doors of the church. **NO MASK-NO ENTRANCE!**
- Ushers will seat you – you may only sit in designated areas (Designated by a blue X).
- There will be No Sign of Peace.
- Doors will be locked after the start of Mass – No late arrivals.
- After the final dismissal, Father will proceed to the sacristy. **DO NOT** leave your seat until directed by an usher.
- No gatherings in the parking lot. Please head out as soon as you reach your car.

RECEIVING COMMUNION ONLY THE BODY OF CHRIST WILL BE DISTRIBUTED

- For your safety and the safety of our priests we ask that you sanitize your hands immediately before going up to Communion.
- Communion will only be given out on the hand.
- Do not leave your pew until directed by an usher.
- Even if you are not receiving, you must get up and process with the line so no one has to climb over you to get in or out of the pew. Simply go up to the priest with your hands crossed over your chest for a blessing.
- After receiving the host in your hand, step to the X located 6 feet away from the priest, quickly lift your mask and consume the host. Return to your seat to pray.

SU PALABRA HOY *por el Reverendo William J. Reilly*

**Trigésimo Segundo Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario
8 de noviembre de 2020**

“No queremos, hermanos, que vivan en la ignorancia acerca de los que ya han muerto, para que no estén tristes como los otros, que no tienen esperanza.

Porque nosotros creemos que Jesús murió y resucitó: de la misma manera, Dios llevará con Jesús a los que murieron con él... Estén prevenidos, porque no saben el día ni la hora.”

En nuestra tradición, recordamos este mes de fieles difuntos. Profesamos nuestra parte en la comunión de los santos. La semana pasada fue Día de Todos Santos. Dirigimos nuestra oración a aquellos quienes esperan entrada a la gloria y a aquellos que viven con el Señor. Quienes vivimos nuestra fe, oramos por otros y le pedimos a los santos que intercedan por nosotros.

Durante este año, constantemente recordando el coronavirus, temenos razón de orar por los miles que han caído en sus redes. San Pablo no dijo que no estemos de duelo, sino que pasemos ese dolor con esperanza, conscientes de la promesa que Jesús nos ha hecho.
