As we return to Daily and Sunday Mass, we have many guidelines and protocols that we must follow for everyone's safety.

We ask for everyone's patience and understanding during this time.

We will continue to Live Stream Mass until we are allowed to have 100% capacity. Remember the Sabbath obligation is still suspended, so if you are ill or at risk please stay home!

PARISHIONER GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO MASS:

You must wear a mask to church; you must wear your mask throughout the entire Mass.

- Please bring your own hand sanitizers to Mass.
- Sunday Mass attendance will be first come first serve. Currently we can only have 100 people in the Church (30% capacity)
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins to allow for seating.
- You may only enter through the Main doors of the church. **NO MASK-NO ENTRANCE!**
- Ushers will seat you – you may only sit in designated areas (Designated by a blue X).
- There will be No Sign of Peace.
- Doors will be locked after the start of Mass – No late arrivals.
- After the final dismissal, Father will proceed to the sacristy. **DO NOT** leave your seat until directed by an usher.
- No gatherings in the parking lot. Please head out as soon as you reach your car.

RECEIVING COMMUNION
ONLY THE BODY OF CHRIST WILL BE
DISTRIBUTED

- For your safety and the safety of our priests we ask that you sanitize your hands immediately before going up to Communion.
- Communion will only be given out on the hand.
- Do not leave your pew until directed by an usher.
- Even if you are not receiving, you must get up and process with the line so no one has to climb over you to get in or out of the pew. Simply go up to the priest with your hands crossed over your chest for a blessing.
- After receiving the host in your hand, step to the X located 6 feet away from the priest, quickly lift your mask and consume the host. Return to your seat to pray.

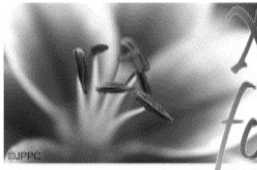

SU PALABRA HOY *por el Reverendo William J. Reilly*
Trigésimo Tercer Domingo en Tiempo Ordinario
15 de noviembre de 2020

“Abre su mano al desvalido y tiende sus brazos al indigente. Engañoso es el encanto y vana la hermosura: la mujer que teme al Señor merece ser alabada. Entréguele el fruto de sus manos y que sus obras la alaben públicamente... Está bien, servidor bueno y fiel, ya que respondiste fielmente en lo poco, te encargaré de mucho más.”

Los proverbios de Salomón escritos hace tanto, ofrecen la oportunidad de reflexionar en los dones y virtudes que siguen vivos hoy. Una persona digna vale más que perlas preciosas.

Considere a los testigos heroicos de Cristo en nuestro propio país, quienes han establecido escuelas y orfanatos, han proveído al inmigrante, al enfermo y los niños. Nuestra historia ha sido escrita por Santa Elizabeth Ann Seton, Madre Catherine Drexel, Rose Duchense. Sus ministerios vuelven una realidad las palabras del rey del antiguo testamento.

Ojalá encontremos el coraje de admirarlos, alabarlos y agradecerles.
