PARISHIONER GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO MASS:

You must wear a mask to church; you must wear your mask throughout the entire Mass.

- Please bring your own hand sanitizers to Mass.
- Sunday Mass attendance will be first come first serve Currently we can only have 100 people in the Church (30% capacity)
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins to allow for seating.
- You may only enter through the Main doors of the church. **NO MASK-NO ENTRANCE!**
- Ushers will seat you – you may only sit in designated areas (Designated by a blue X).
- There will be No Sign of Peace.
- Doors will be locked after the start of Mass – No late arrivals.
- After the final dismissal, Father will proceed to the sacristy. DO NOT leave your seat until directed by an usher.
- No gatherings in the parking lot. Please head out as soon as you reach your car.

ONLY THE BODY OF CHRIST WILL BE DISTRIBUTED

- For your safety and the safety of our priests we ask that you sanitize your hands immediately before going up to Communion.
- Communion will only be given out on the hand.
- Do not leave your pew until directed by an usher.
- Even if you are not receiving, you must get up and process with the line so no one has to climb over you go get in or out of the pew. Simply go up to the priest with your hands crossed over your chest for a blessing.
- After receiving the host in your hand, step to the X located 6 feet away from the priest, quickly lift your mask and consume the host
Return to your seat to pray.

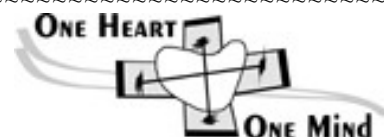

### SU PALABRA HOY

### Segundo Domingo de Pascua

11 de Abril de 2021

**“La multitud de los creyentes tenía un solo corazón y una sola alma. Nadie consideraba sus bienes como propios, sino que todo era común entre ellos. Los Apóstoles daban testimonio con mucho poder de la resurrección del Señor Jesús y gozaban de gran estima. Ninguno padecía necesidad.”**

La vida de la primera comunidad Cristiana no era diferente a la nuestra. El ideal presentado en los Hechos de los Apóstoles vendrá después a revelar el sufrimiento, persecución y obstáculos que afrontaron los primeros discípulos del Señor. La gracia de Dios estaba verdaderamente presente y manifiesta al ser ellos testigos. El espíritu les dió poder.

Podemos pensar que nuestra actual experiencia es más dura, al observar a gente sufriendo a causa de guerra, persecución y odio. A pesar de que esta realidad existe, no nos permite el darnos por vencidos, sino más bien a afrontar la causa de la persecución y adversidad. Por lo menos puedo hacer una cosa para cambiar la situación. ¿Qué es esta cosa que me resuelvo a hacer esta semana como seña de que deseo experimentar la primera comunidad Cristiana por mí mismo? La Pascua nos dice: ‘El vive.’
