GODPARENT AND CONFIRMATION SPONSOR FORMS

Very often, we get requests from people who need a sponsor form, because they were given the honor of serving as a Confirmation Sponsor or a Godparent for Baptism. These forms serve as proof that the person is an active member of our Church, attends Mass, here, regularly and is a contributor to the Church. And...Very often we have no record of this person having any activity here at St. Anastasia's.

Please understand that we are not able to provide such a document unless this person has been an **active parish member**. This means that the individual must be registered within the parish and attending Mass regularly. When you turn 18 years of age you must register on your own. The reason why many parishes require this form is to ensure that sponsors are adequately prepared to guide a newly Baptized, or Confirmandi, into the church with a solid grounding in Church teachings and practice.

Please remind others to think carefully before accepting this responsibility and to understand that it will require active participation in the church.

Next week our parish will take up the 137th annual National Black and Indian Mission collection. Our support of this collection helps build the Church in African American, Native American, and Alaska Native communities from coast to coast. Schools, parish religious education programs, and diocesan ministries depend on your generosity to help them spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ!

PARISHIONER GUIDELINES

- Please bring your own hand sanitizers to Mass.
- Sunday Mass attendance will be first come first serve. Currently we can only have 100 people in the Church (30% capacity)
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass begins to allow for seating.
- Please sit in the area you are comfortable in. We have socially distanced areas and sit as you wish areas.
- Masks are required for unvaccinated parishioners.
- There is an outdoor speaker in the back of the church for anyone wishing to stay outside.
- There will be No Sign of Peace.
- Doors will be locked after the start of Mass – No late arrivals.

UNTIL ALL PANDEMIC RESTRICTIONS ARE REMOVED HOLY COMMUNION WILL BE DISTRIBUTED ONLY UNDER THE SPECIES OF THE EUCHARISTIC BREAD

- For your safety and the safety of our priests we ask that you sanitize your hands immediately before going up to Communion.
- Communion will only be given out on the hand.
- Even if you are not receiving, you must get up and process with the line so no one has to climb over you to get in or out of the pew. Simply go up to the priest with your hands crossed over your chest for a blessing.
- After receiving the host in your hand, step to the X located 6 feet away from the priest; consume the host. Return to your seat to pray.
