GODPARENT AND CONFIRMATION SPONSOR FORMS

Very often, we get requests from people who need a sponsor form, because they were given the honor of serving as a Confirmation Sponsor or a Godparent for Baptism. These forms serve as proof that the person is an active member of our Church, attends Mass, here, regularly and is a contributor to the Church. And...Very often we have no record of this person having any activity here at St. Anastasia's.

Please understand that we are not able to provide such a document unless this person has been an **active parish member**. This means that the individual must be registered within the parish and attending Mass regularly. When you turn 18 years of age you must register on your own.

The reason why many parishes require this form is to ensure that sponsors are adequately prepared to guide a newly Baptized, or Confirmandi, into the church with a solid grounding in Church teachings and practice.

Please remind others to think carefully before accepting this responsibility and to understand that it will require active participation in the church.
