The following is an email that was generated and sent out to some of Father Joe's known contacts:

**Subject: God Bless,**

**Hi, how are you doing?**

**I need a favor from you, email me as soon as you get this message.**

**God Bless,  
Rev. Joseph Tyrrell**

**IT IS NOT FROM FATHER JOE!**

Do not respond to these emails and never give anyone money or personal information without verifying its legitimacy.

**#2: "Text Message from the Pastor"**

Please be aware of a scam where parishioners receive text messages, supposedly from the pastor, asking for help or money. The messages are personalized and are signed with the Pastor's full name, and a promise to reimburse the parishioner. The parishioner is directed to purchase gift cards and to send a photo of the cards back to the pastor, along with the pin numbers.

The messages are not really from your pastor. the church does not solicit gift cards in this manner. If you receive such a message, do not text back and do not click on any links within the message.

In general, you should always verify the legitimacy of any request before sending money, gift cards, etc.

## *“What’s in your backpack?”*

Reflection #4 by Marla Silbernagel,  
DRE St. Patrick’s Church



Part of my preparation for walking the Camino was deciding what essentials I needed for a 35-day adventure. Months before my departure date, I began to squirrel away what I thought were my necessary items, only to find when I began to pack my 28-liter pack, that much of what I considered “essential” was simply not going to fit inside. I managed, with my husband’s help, to reassess and repack. In doing so I brought the weight down to just under 17 lbs. This was heavier than I wanted but it was going to have to work.

Day by day, my body grew stronger and adjusted to the weight of the backpack. As I considered this, memories of my children’s school backpacks washed over me. Like most kids, my children loved picking out their new backpacks as we shopped for back-to-school items. We discussed size, pocket position, durability of the fabric, and overall design, as we shopped.

During these times, we would take time to think about the size of the books they would carry. This was especially important when they made the jump from elementary to middle school. As we would talk about what was going inside, I would often look for opportunities to talk about things they shouldn’t carry in their backpacks. Guilt, resentment, jealousy, inappropriate shame, these things, I explained, are things that were just too heavy and bulky to carry. Better to let them go so as not to become overburdened with a heavy backpack. They would nod, signaling they understood, (as they got older, they probably rolled their eyes too.) and I rested easier, knowing I had given them a foundation because I spoke the words, “You don’t carry everything that comes your way.”

But, as with many other things, my thoughts on this changed as I walked the Camino. I met a man, Anthony, at one of the early stages. His group, and mine, bonded quickly and we shared stories and experiences when we would eventually meet up at different albergues along the Way.

During one of these times, he shared with us that he lost his son and was carrying his ashes to bury them at the Cruz Fiera, or Iron Cross. This is a place, about three quarters into the Camino, with a simple iron cross where people leave a stone that they have brought with them on their journey. Each stone has special significance and is placed at the foot of the cross to symbolize something left behind.

The news Anthony shared with us was shocking information because nowhere, in our previous discussions, had Anthony demonstrated any signs of grief or sadness. One day as we were leaving to go our separate ways, I watched Anthony from behind as he walked away and noticed that his backpack was very small. I contemplated the enormity of the weight he was carrying in his backpack and the fact that he didn’t get to choose the contents. He carried a burden that breaks the heart of every parent.

Our backpacks are truly metaphors for the things we choose to carry in this life. Some people have backpacks full of stuff they don’t need and seldom use. Some people have backpacks full of unspoken, and unresolved emotions. Some people, like Anthony, carry burdens so heavy we can’t even contemplate them.

Anthony’s good nature and congenial demeanor reminded me that we need to be gentle with one another. Outward appearances don’t always point to the truth. We simply don’t know what burdens others carry in their backpacks.
