The class is held in the Parish Center—Education Building, Room 7 at 7:30 pm. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, (RCIA).

RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: A process for those who wish to learn more about the Catholic Faith, or for Catholic adults, who after being baptized as infants, wish now to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. For more information, please call our Parish Office.

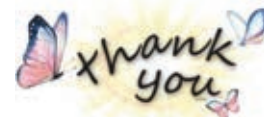

A Daily Ignatian Examen

1. Recall that you are in the presence of God who loves you.
2. Thank God for the gifts you have received.
3. Be aware of how the Holy Spirit has aided in your actions this day.
4. Examen how you have lived (positively & negatively) this day.
5. Ask for forgiveness, hope and courage as you move toward tomorrow.

A Few Final Points

Friendship and intimacy with God take time and regular attention.

Ten minutes each day is a reasonable amount for this prayer.

Cover all five points each day but linger more on one point or another if necessary.

Let the Spirit guide you through it.

Find a prayer space and make it sacred for yourself.
