Prayer for the Homeless

Not only because God took on our flesh and dwelt among us, but because of the birth of Christ in our hearts. It has been said, "If Christ is not born in our hearts today, then his birth 2,000 years ago is not complete." He hungers to be born in us. And we hunger for fullness of life by giving him life today.

The reality today has not changed from 2,000 years ago. Christ is still in need of food and shelter. He said to us, "I was hungry, and you fed me: I was homeless, and you gave me shelter." We don't need to ask when. He told us, "Whenever you did it to the least of my sisters and brothers."

We are blessed in many ways, not the least of which is that when we get up in the morning, we can turn on the light, go to the bathroom and turn on the faucet to brush our teeth, shower, shave, etc. Most of our sisters and brothers don't have that luxury. They live in shacks of poles, a tin roof and a dirt floor. They have no electricity. They have no water, not only to wash but to drink. They are not just "poor people". They are Christ in our sisters and brothers. Christ still says to us, "I hunger. I Thirst. I need shelter."

May we not simply pray words for peace and joy this Christmas. May we pray through our actions to give food and shelter to our Lord. Let us pray for open hearts, to give birth to him in us, and to us. Now that's a real Christmas present.
