FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Deuteronomy 18: 15-20

The author wants to find a place for prophecy in his country. He describes a true prophet as a native Israelite who is called by Yahweh and continues the prophetic role of Moses.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 7: 32-35

Paul is addressing newly married couples. We note his view of the equality of men and women. He advises couples but does not impose any solutions.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 21-28

Capernaum is the setting for this last section of Chapter One. Jesus' "amazing" teaching did not rely on appeals to Scripture or other teachers for verification. The healing He works presages the end of the power of demons.

An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, **so that she may be holy in both body and spirit.** A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, **how she may please her husband.**

I am telling you this for your own benefit, not to impose a restraint upon you, but for the sake of propriety and adherence to the Lord without distraction.

Mark 1:21-28

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for **he taught them as one having authority** and not as the scribes.

In their synagogue was a man with an unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him.

All were amazed and asked one another, "What is this? **A new teaching with authority. He commands** even the unclean spirits and **they obey him.**"

His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

R. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

CREED

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
