SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Reading I: Genesis 22: 1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

Yahweh gives Abraham the ultimate test, that of sacrificing his favorite son Isaac. Observing Abraham's unquestioning obedience, Yahweh calls off the killing, accepting the sacrifice of a nearby ram. He also promises Abraham abundant rewards, including the growth of a great people as his descendants.

Reading II: Romans 8: 31b-34

St. Paul provides his readers a solid basis for their hope, specifying along the way the unique power of Jesus' intercession for us with His Father. He also asks "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

The Gospel: Mark 9: 2-10

The transfiguration of Jesus was such a dazzling experience for Peter that he nervously proposes setting up three tents so that the three persons from the world beyond could stay and prolong it. But immediately after, Jesus brings the three apostles down to earth to complete their earthly mission.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF GENESIS

Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "**Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love,** and go to the land of Moriah. **There you shall offer him up** as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you."

When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the

LORD's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to **God since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son.**" As Abraham looked about, he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket. So he went and took the ram and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son. Again the LORD's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: "**I swear by myself,** declares the LORD, that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing— **all this because you obeyed my command.**"

Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us, who will condemn? Christ Jesus it is who died—or, rather, was raised—who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.

**A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL
ACCORDING TO ST. MARK**

Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus.

Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "**This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.**" Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them. As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So, they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.

The Gospel of the Lord.

I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins, and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Season of Lent

Last December I shared with you some ideas about **Advent**. Today I would like to talk about our present season of **Lent**. These are two very important seasons in our liturgical year and they are related with slightly different focuses. Be aware these are my own views.

I see **Advent** as a time of preparation and anticipation and expectation. It is the preparation for the coming of the Messiah and all the promise that gift and grace will allow us. I view **Lent** as a time of reparation, introspection, and fulfillment. With Advent we have a beginning; with Lent we have the completion of the promise. Advent prepared us for the **birth of a promise**; Lent prepares us for the **fulfillment of the promise** through the suffering, death, and culminating with the Resurrection of Christ.

One season with its candles and promise of light occurs in the winter and in the Darkness of our seasons and lives. The other gives us the joy and promise of Rebirth and Spring. In Advent we decorate with candles and greenery; in Lent we strip away adornment and put-on penitential colors not to be distracted, but to focus inward.

Lent asks us to go both inside and outside ourselves to discover our purpose and our relationship with God and each other. We should ask ourselves 'where am I with my friends? my community? my world? myself and with my God? Most importantly, how do I improve in all those areas?

Lent has always been a time of "giving up". I remember the *pence boxes* we received in grammar school. I dutifully placed my pennies, nickels and dimes inside. Then we all try to avoid chocolate, cakes, and gossip, and maybe a Dunkin Donut! They are all still full of value because they do discipline us and make us aware of some of our "weaknesses".

Strict grammarians tell us not to end a sentence with a preposition so I cannot say "give up". I would rather advocate this year to "give". There are so many opportunities around us. People need food, rides to doctor appointments, clothes, monetary donations, smiles, phone calls, go ahead of me in line, can I help you carry that, do you need to talk, hold the door, need a hug, can I pick up your mail, need anything from the store, I will pray for you. See it is easy and does not cost a cent!

The number forty in Biblical times represented something of significance or importance. May these forty days of Lent allow us to grow deeper in faith, wiser in our knowledge, closer to our God, kinder in our relationships, and gentler in our treatment of our world. I pray we all have a powerful and grace-filled journey this Lenten season. God in His Abundance loves us all.
