FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Reading I: Jeremiah 31: 31-34

These four verses have been described by scholars as "one of the profoundest and most moving in the entire Bible." It marks the only time in the Old Testament when the words "new covenant" are used.

Reading II: Hebrews 5: 7-9

Jesus' call from God makes Him uniquely qualified as one who can sympathize with sinners. His obedience elevated the value of His death.

The Gospel: John 12: 20-33

The Gentile Greeks come seeking Jesus, thus opening a new dimension of evangelization past the Jews and Samaritans. The well-known parable about a grain of wheat Jesus uses to comment on His pending death.

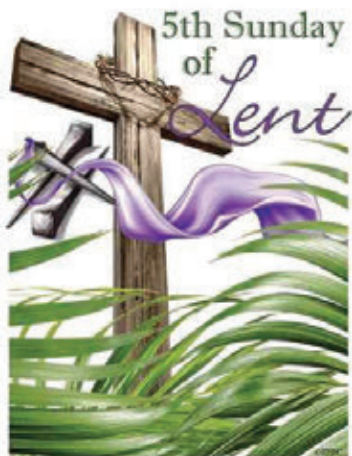

**A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL
ACCORDING TO ST. JOHN**

John 12:20-33

Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "**The hour has come** for the **Son of Man to be glorified**."

Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves me.

"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But **it was for this purpose that I came to this hour**. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it and will glorify it again." The crowd there heard it and said it was thunder; but others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come for my sake but

for yours. Now is the time of judgment on this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And **when I am lifted up** from the earth, **I will draw everyone to myself**." He said this indicating the kind of death he would die.
