The class is held in the Parish Center—Education Building, Room 7 at 7:30 pm. Adults are baptized and confirmed at the Easter Vigil after completing the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults, (RCIA).

**RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults:** A process for those who wish to learn more about the Catholic Faith, or for Catholic adults, who after being baptized as infants, wish now to receive the sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. For more information, please call our Parish Office.

**THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:** It is an honor for our parish to celebrate marriage with couples. Please contact the parish immediately after engagement to begin the preparation process. The recommended time for preparation is six months.

## Godparent and Confirmation Sponsor Forms

Very often, we get requests from people who need a sponsor form, because they were given the honor of serving as a Confirmation Sponsor or a Godparent for Baptism. These forms serve as proof that the person *is* an active member of our Church, attends Mass, here, regularly and is a contributor to the Church. And... Very often we have no record of this person having any activity here at St. Patrick's.

Please understand, that we are not able to provide such a document unless this person has been an **active parish member**. This means that the individual must be registered within the parish and attending mass regularly.

The reason why many parishes require this form is to ensure that sponsors are adequately prepared to guide a newly Baptized, or Confirmandi, into the church with a solid grounding in Church teachings and practice. Please remind others to think carefully before accepting this responsibility and to understand that it will require active participation in the church.
