FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK . . .

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. It is an opportunity for us to contemplate the mystery of God. Remember, this is not something we have to figure out, but something we must discover. We will never fully understand God. But just because we cannot say everything about God, does not mean we cannot say anything about God.

We start every prayer with “In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.” It should not go unnoticed that it is the *name* of God not the *names* of God. We are making a profound theological point here. Our God is one. And yet, He manifests Himself in three divine persons. Many have called this the “central mystery of our faith.” The Father was able to send his Son to save us and the Holy Spirit to remain with us forever.

Even deeper into this mystery, we can assert that our God is relational. The intimate relationship between the Father, Son and Spirit make up the essence of divinity. It is into and from this communion of divine love that we are created. Made in God’s image and likeness, we are preconditioned to love and to be loved. In fact, we are most like the Trinity when we love God and our neighbors as ourselves. Unfortunately this past week we saw the lack of love and compassion for one another. The Trinity reminds us that the distinct persons of the Godhead are different. Yet, Divinity is contained in all. Being made in this image our humanity should define the unity of all our races. That unity should show forth in how we respect and love one another.

May this divine mystery of God’s love continue to unfold for each of us and may we be blessed ... in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

PRAYER FOR SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

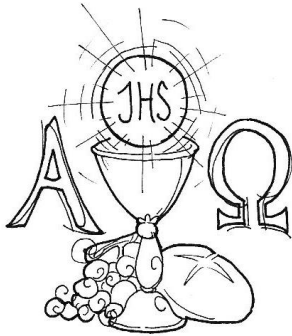
My Jesus, I believe that

Readings for June 14

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

1st Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14-16

Moses said to the people: "Remember how for forty
years now the LORD, your God, has directed all your
journeying in the desert, so as to test you by affliction
and find out whether or not it was your intention to
keep his commandments. He therefore let you be
afflicted with hunger, and then fed you with manna, a
food unknown to you and your fathers, in order to
show you that not by bread alone does one live, but
by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the
LORD. "Do not forget the LORD, your God, who
brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of
slavery; who guided you through the vast and terrible
desert with its saraph serpents and scorpions, its
parched and waterless ground; who brought forth
water for you from the flinty rock and fed you in the
desert with manna, a food unknown to your fathers."

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Brothers and sisters: The cup of blessing that we
bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ?
The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the
body of Christ? Because the loaf of bread is one, we,
though many, are one body, for we all partake of the
one loaf.

Gospel: John 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jewish
crowds: "I am the living
bread that came down
from heaven; whoever
eats this bread will live
forever; and the bread that
I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews
quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this
man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them,
"Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of
the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have
life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my
blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last
day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true
drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood
remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father
sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also
the one who feeds on me will have life because of me.
This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike
your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats
this bread will live forever."
