FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK . . .

Sometimes our most obvious blessings from God get overlooked and taken for granted. God often showers us with gifts, and they become so common that we don’t realize just how blessed we are. Let me give you an example: our church music ministry. When I have to lead the music at our weekend Masses, you can certainly tell there is something lacking in our worship. Contrast this when we have guitars, or organists, or choirs singing and playing, leading us in praise and worship to God. The contrast is stark. Sometimes it’s nice to have a simple Mass with simple music. However, the Priest having to lead the music as well as the worship is not what the church envisions. That is why it is always better to have a music ministry to help the congregation lift their voices in prayer and song.

Let me be frank. We do have good musicians in this parish. People who have dedicated themselves to this important ministry and do so faithfully. Men and women who have given weekend after weekend to our church. They have been given a talent to play an instrument and/or to sing, and they freely share it with our congregation. Their gift is our gift, and it comes from God. We should never take them for granted.

If you are interested in joining them, please contact me or one of the church musicians to volunteer. There is always need for more choir members and musicians. So let us continue to thank God for those who are so actively involved in the music ministry of our church.

PRAYER FOR SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

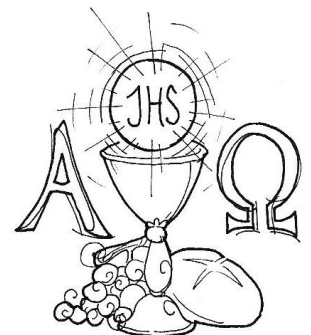
My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

Readings for JULY 5: 14th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1st Reading: Zechariah 9:9-10

Thus says the LORD: Rejoice heartily, O daughter Zion, shout for joy, O daughter Jerusalem! See, your king shall come to you; a just savior is he, meek, and riding on an ass, on a colt, the foal of an ass. He shall banish the chariot from Ephraim, and the horse from Jerusalem; the warrior's bow shall be banished, and he shall proclaim peace to the nations. His dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth.

2nd Reading: Romans 8:9, 11-13

Brothers and sisters: You are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you. Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit that dwells in you. Consequently, brothers and sisters, we are not debtors to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.

Gospel: Matthew 11:25-30

At that time Jesus exclaimed: "I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to little ones. Yes, Father, such has been your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father.
