There is a special envelope in your quarterly Church envelope set, and also on the cabinets in Church, that you may use to include your deceased loved ones in the Masses for all the faithful departed during November.

All Saints Day is a Holy Day. During this Mass we call upon those holy men and women who have gone before us and now sit in the company of God. We ask for their intercession and humbly request they bring our petitions before the face of God. All Saints Day reminds us too of the Church triumphant, which includes not only the canonized saints, but also the countless faithful who have taken their place in heaven. This day should inspire us to live our life in accord with the Gospel so that we too will be saints.

All Souls' Day is another opportunity for us to pray for the departed. On this day we seek God's mercy for our beloved dead so that they make the journey to heaven. It is for this reason we gather in the cemetery, the hallowed ground in which our families are buried, to pray their souls home to God.

A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. One can gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery each day between November 1 and November 8. These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.

## **READINGS FOR OCTOBER 31:**

### **31<sup>st</sup> Sunday Of Ordinary Time**

#### **1<sup>st</sup> Reading: Deuteronomy 6:2-6**

Moses spoke to the people, saying: "Fear the LORD, your God, and keep, throughout the days of your lives, all his statutes and commandments which I enjoin on you, and thus have long life. Hear then, Israel, and be careful to observe them, that you may grow and prosper the more, in keeping with the promise of the LORD, the God of your fathers, to give you a land flowing with milk and honey. "Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone! Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today."

#### **2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Hebrews 7:23-28**

Brothers and sisters: The levitical priests were many because they were prevented by death from remaining in office, but Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. He has no need, as did the high priests, to offer sacrifice day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did that once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever.

#### **Gospel: Mark 12:28-34**

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: *Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.* The second is this: *You shall love your neighbor as yourself.* There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.
