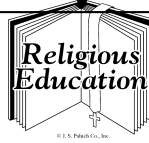
ASCENSION THURSDAY, MAY 14TH

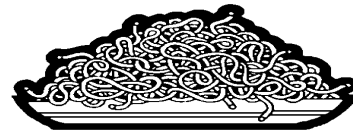

Kidney Stones

Kidney stones occur when substances in the urine do not dissolve as they should. Kidney stones are made up of a variety of chemicals such as calcium, oxalate, uric acid and cysteine. Kidney stones are often small enough to pass through the urinary tract without any symptoms, but larger stones can lodge anywhere in the ureters (tube from the kidney to the bladder) and cause pain.

Symptoms of kidney stones:

- Severe pain that moves from the back to the groin
- Bloody urine
- Painful and frequent urination

Nausea and vomiting

Diagnosis of kidney stones:

- Abdominal x-rays, ultrasound, or CT scan
- Urinalysis (to find microscopic blood)

Treatment of kidney stones:

- Endoscopy - involves passing a tube through the urethra and up to the ureter or kidney so that kidney stones may be removed or broken up into smaller pieces.

Lithotripsy - uses shock waves which penetrate the body to break up the stones to smaller pieces which can be passed.

Prevention: Drink plenty of water!

WILL TO LIVE (pro-life living will) is a legal document that can help protect you and those you love when you cannot speak for yourselves.

THE WILL TO LIVE protects your own life and the lives of your family members when you cannot speak for yourselves

- **Names** someone you trust to safeguard your life when you cannot speak for yourself as your "health care agent"
- **Names** backup agents if your first choice can't serve
- **Describes** the treatment you do and do not want to guide your health care agent and physicians
- **Protects** your family and health care agent from pressure from health care providers and others by allowing them to prove what you really did want

Relieves the agony of decision making for them by making your wishes clear

What is the Will to Live?

The Will to Live is a legal document that you can sign which:

- Names someone to make health care decisions for you (your "health care agent") if you develop a condition that makes it impossible for you to speak for yourself (become "incompetent"), **and** Makes clear (in the form of written instructions to your health care agent) what medical treatment you would want if you can no longer speak for yourself.

Free Legal Help With the Will to Live

While you may be able to complete the "Will to Live" advance directive on your own, if you feel the need for legal advice in doing so, volunteer attorneys working with the Alliance Defense Fund are willing, free of charge, to help you make your health care wishes legally clear. If you have any questions concerning your advance directive, we urge you to seek proper legal counsel.

Cálculos Renales

Cálculos renales ocurren cuando sustancias en la orina no se disuelven apropiadamente. Cálculos renales son compuestos de una variedad de sustancias químicas como calcio, oxalato, ácido úrico y cistíneo. Estos cálculos frecuentemente son suficientemente pequeños para poder pasar por el tracto urinario, sin haber síntomas, pero los cálculos mas grandes pueden meterse en cualquier sitio en los uréteres (tubo que va del riñón a la vejiga) y producen dolor.

Síntomas:

- Dolor muy fuerte que pasa de la espalda a la ingle
- Orina con sangre
- Orina que duele y es frecuente
- Nausea y vómito


Diagnosis de Cálculos Renales:

- Rayos X del abdomen, ultrasonido, o CT Scan
- Análisis de la orina (para buscar si hay sangre microscópica)

Tratamiento para Cálculos Renales:

- Endoscopia—pasar un tubo dentro del uréter y subirlo hasta el uréter o el riñón para sacar o quebrar los cálculos para que pedazos pequeños puedan pasar.
- Lithotripsy—olas de shock que penetran el cuerpo para quebrar los cálculos y que los pedazos pequeños puedan pasar.

Prevención: !Tome mucha agua!
