SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY

Isaiah 60:1-6: Jerusalem is presented as one of the poles of the earth to which a long procession of peoples

throughout the world stream.

Ephesians 3:2-3,5-6 The author writes that the mystery of the incarnation, Jesus becoming human, was revealed by the Holy Spirit.

Matthew 2:1-12 Astrologers or Magi come from the east to offer their gifts to the "newborn King of the Jews." Upon seeing the infant they kneel down in homage at the revelation of God's glory.

Discussion questions: How can we be the light for the nations in our conduct and by our example? What gifts are we ready to part with in order to offer praise to God?

The Solemnity of the Epiphany is also called in some cultures the Feast of the Three Kings. The

tradition expands the details from Matthew's gospel and so there are three kings who journey from different continents (Europe, Asia and Africa) to bring gifts. They subsequently are given the names of Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. In many of the cultures among Latin as well as Eastern Orthodox peoples, this is the day for the exchange of gifts.

SACRAMENTAL LITURGIES: ADULT BAPTISM

There are three scrutinies during Lent that correspond with the three selections from John's gospel for the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of the season. These are the passages about the Samaritan woman, the man born blind and the resurrection of Lazarus. They correspond with the scrutiny themes of water, light and life. These rites also consist of an exorcism, in which the assembly prays that the elect may never be separated from God.
