ATTENTION: GIFT BEARERS AT MASS

If you would like to bring up the offertory gifts of bread and wine at Sunday Mass we ask you to please see the ushers before Mass begins. It is also a good idea to sit near to the gift table.

Starting November 21st and 22nd we will change the way the offertory gifts are brought to the Altar. It is important for the ushers to be aware that you are willing to bring up the offertory gifts.

Many times the ushers are searching for people to carry the offertory gifts. Other times the people who wish to carry the gifts sit far away from the gift table and it takes time for the ushers to locate them and begin the offertory gift procession.

The family that has offered a Mass intention for that Mass has priority in being gift bearers at that Mass, however, they should still notify the ushers and be seated somewhere near to the gift table.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES NEEDS VOLUNTEERS

A collaboration of Orange County organizations seeks multiple volunteers to help run tax preparation sites or to prepare taxes right in the town where you live or work. There are over 20 tax sites in Orange County.

Each year, this group of community organizations offers free tax preparation for members of our community, with a special outreach to the elderly and the low-income population. Volunteers are needed to act as tax preparers, greeters, help with personal computer technology issues, market the program or prepare taxes. Full training is provided at no cost for every role. Training for tax preparation role takes place in the fall. It is free, extensive and ends with the IRS certification.

Tax sites are open February through April. Volunteers set their own schedules, which can include combinations of weekdays, weekends, or weeknights.
