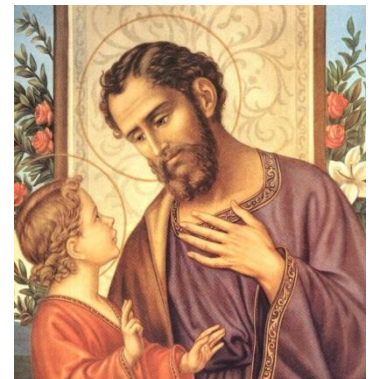

PRECAUTIONS FOR PUBLIC MASS

DAILY MASS FOR LENT

During Lent, millions of Catholics throughout the world attend daily Mass, the greatest of Lenten devotions. Weekday Mass, at St. Joseph's, is at 8:00 a.m. in the Main Church. Stations of the Cross are conducted in the main Church each Wednesday at 12:10 p.m. and each Friday at 7:00 p.m. (in English) and 8:00 p.m. (in Spanish).

GOOD FRIDAY: A DAY OF FAST, ABSTINENCE; LENTEN FRIDAYS ARE DAYS OF ABSTINENCE

FASTING requires that only one full meal be taken per day. Two other smaller meals may be taken, during the day, to maintain physical strength, but these two meals, together, should not equal a full meal in quantity. Fasting is obligatory for all those who have reached the age of 18 and continues until they are 59. Those not specifically obligated to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.

ABSTINENCE prohibits individuals from eating meat on a particular day. Abstinence obliges all those who have reached the age of 14 and continues to oblige throughout their entire life. Those not specifically obligated to abstain from eating meat are encouraged to join in this discipline to the extent that they are able.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross will be offered in the main Church on Wednesdays at 12:10 p.m. and on Fridays at 7:00 p.m. in English and at 8:00 p.m. in Spanish. Social distancing and the wearing of masks are required and all are asked to remain in their pews.



PERPETUAL ADORATION



“Jesus didn’t ask a lot. When He arrived in the garden of Gethsemane, He gave His apostles just two small tasks. He didn’t tell them to fast, make a sacrifice, or do a 54-day novena. Nor did He ask them to start a program, preach the Gospel, or perform some noble community service ... Rather, all Jesus wanted them to do is “watch and pray” with Him.

“Think about that. In His greatest moment of agony, as He was preparing to face the full brunt of His passion and death, Jesus simply wanted his apostles’ hearts: their friendship, their time, their full attention, their love. He asked them to keep watch with Him and pray with Him.”

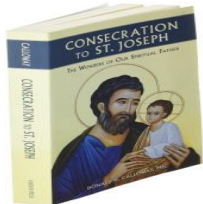

READINGS FOR THIS SUNDAY

FIRST READING

From the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah (Jer 31:31-34)

The days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah.

It will not be like the covenant I made with their fathers the day I took them by the hand to lead them forth from the land of Egypt; for they broke My covenant, and I had to show Myself their Master, says the LORD. GOSPEL

From the Gospel of John (Jn 12:20-33)

Some Greeks who had come to worship at the Passover Feast came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus.

Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit. Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life. Whoever serves Me must follow Me, and where I am, there also will My servant be. The Father will honor whoever serves Me.

"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say?
