Holy Angels Parish Religious Education Program (PREP)

Religious Education Classes for Grades 6-8 will begin on Sunday, Sept. 8, 2019 at the 8:30AM Mass. Students will be dismissed at 11:30AM. Grades 1-5 begin classes on Monday Sept. 9, 2019 at 5:30PM in the church basement. Students will be dismissed approximately 7:05PM following the evening Mass.

Registration forms are available in the vestibule of the church. Students should be attending all 8 years of religious instruction. Keep in mind, for the reception of any sacrament, a minimum of two full years of instruction must be completed prior to the sacrament. For First Communion, the child must attend 2 complete years before receiving, regardless of age. For Confirmation, the student needs to be present for grades 6-8 because the date of Confirmation varies yearly according to the diocese.

Also, as per Diocesan guidelines, if any student wishes to play CYO basketball, he/she must be enrolled and satisfactorily attending a CCD program for that year and the prior year. Any questions, contact Joette Foris, Religious Education Coordinator, at 570-490-0099

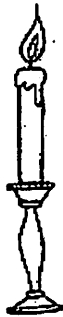
