From the Pastor's Desk

The Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

I'm sure some of us have been in a situation similar to that of Jesus in the gospel today. Perhaps someone started off with a compliment, a kind word, a vote of confidence – but then changed their tune to a criticism, a doubt, or even a test asking us to prove ourselves. “Teacher we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. **And**, you are not concerned with anyone’s opinion...” Ready? BUT, “tell us then what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?” A trap has been set for Jesus. His response hit the nail on the head: “Why are you testing me, you hypocrites?” To say that one did not have to pay the tax could have left Jesus charged with treason, going against the Roman government. He would surely pay the consequences for that! Saying that indeed one had to pay the tax would have brought Jesus disfavor among the Jewish community and their authorities. He might have been considered a traitor. After all the Romans significantly taxed the Jewish community and employed Jewish tax collectors who were known for cheating their own people. Neither answer that Jesus could have given would have been the correct one!

Jesus, a masterful teacher, makes a response that I certainly don't believe I would have thought to make, especially when under pressure! “Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.” With this response Jesus made sure his listeners fulfilled both the civil and the religious/spiritual law. As often as I have read or listened to this gospel, I pause for a minute and muse to myself, wondering what look may have appeared on the faces of the Herodians and the Pharisees’ disciples when Jesus made this response. And furthermore, what look crossed may have crossed the faces of the Pharisees?

As we further reflect on this gospel passage, we might ask ourselves if we are fulfilling all our civic responsibilities on the local, state, and national levels. Are we honest in all our commitments? We might also ask if we are giving to God what is God’s. Does God have my heart and mind? Do my words and actions imitate those of Jesus? Have I sought and offered forgiveness? Do I reverence the Body of Christ, both in the Eucharist and in my brothers and sisters? Do I give God enough time in prayer? Does God have my attention? What do I believe God is asking of me and how am I attempting to respond?

Two Confirmation Celebrations This Week

As I mentioned at all the Masses last weekend, our parish is celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation twice this coming week. We welcome Auxiliary Bishop Edmund Whalen on Tuesday and Auxiliary Bishop John O’Hara on Thursday as they anoint our students with Chrism and seal them with the gift of the Holy Spirit.

In the name of the entire parish, we congratulate our students, their sponsors and their families. This is an important step in their spiritual lives and helps to remind us that the Church and our parish has a present and a future! We are happy to welcome a number of students from Christ the King Parish, who are celebrating Confirmation with us. This type of collaboration in the celebration of the Sacraments is a sign of unity among our parishes and reminds us that we can both trust and share our parish life and resources for the greater good of the wider Church.
