From the Pastor's Desk

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time: **URGENT! URGENT!**

As we listen to the Scriptures this weekend, we are reminded that as Christians, we have to view the world, and the way in which we live in it, with a certain urgency. In the Gospel of St. John, Jesus prays for his disciples (present and future) who “are in the world but not of the world” and we are challenged to see and do things differently from those who do not have faith in Jesus Christ.

In our first reading this weekend, Jonah is sent to the city of Nineveh, to announce that in forty days it would be destroyed. In the second reading, Paul tells the Corinthian community, “time is running out...the world in its present form is passing away.” In the Gospel, Jesus tells the people of Galilee, “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.” These messages foreshadow the upcoming penitential season of Lent (which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17th.)

Even though we have not yet entered the Lenten season, we need to hear the message in today's readings. How would we live our lives if we believed that time is running out? Do I live with regret and shame for the things I did but never could do over or take back? Do I live with regret and longing for things I never took the chance to do? Do I believe that Jesus is calling ME, with the same immediacy he called the first disciples, to repentance and belief in the gospel? Do I sense the urgency for change in my own life? Is there anything holding me back from being a faithful follower of Jesus? What do I need to set aside in order to live a more genuine Christian life? Let us take some time this week to consider the call of this weekend's Scriptures. Perhaps we can make the psalm response our prayer this week: “Teach me YOUR ways, O Lord.”

Reflect further on the mercy God showed in the first reading. When God witnessed how the Ninevites “turned from their evil ways, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do; he did not carry it out.” God is filled with mercy, compassion and clemency. Our sins, no matter how grave, no matter how many, could never render God's mercy powerless!

When we hear the call of Jesus in the gospel, as the early disciples did, what are we willing to leave behind to follow the Lord? Are there things we can do without that get in the way of my affirmative response to the Lord? What are they? How do I make following the Lord my top priority? After all, He made us HIS priority!

Scheduling Baptisms and Weddings

Due to the pandemic, many families postponed their celebrations of baptisms and marriages in the church. If you are considering when to schedule or reschedule these Sacraments, please do not wait to call the office to make arrangements. Because there is preparation needed for these Sacraments, and because we are following CDC guidelines for smaller gatherings of families, it is important to call as soon as possible in order that we can try to meet everyone's requests. ***We remind those planning weddings to check with the church before securing the date with a venue.***

Of course we remind everyone that those who are asked to be baptismal or confirmation sponsors must have received all three Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation. Sponsors should be practicing Catholics who model a good Christian life to the ones they have been chosen to sponsor.

Details Next Weekend

In next weekend's bulletin we will share details about the distribution of Ashes on February 17th. The Archdiocese of New York has made specific recommendations for the imposition of blessed ashes which we will incorporate as best we can into our liturgies. Like everything else during this time of pandemic, things will be different from what we are accustomed to.
