From the Pastor's Desk

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Grumble, Grumble... Give Me, Give Me

In the first reading for this weekend's liturgy, we once again hear that the "whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron." The community complained to and about their leaders! Would they ever be happy? Would their leaders ever be enough or do enough to satisfy? Some would simply say, "no!" Despite all the grumbling, Moses remained faithful to the mission that God had entrusted to him, as a leader for His people. When Moses sought God's assistance, God responded generously – with food, with bread, with water, with protection, with victory.

In the Gospel, a continuation of the "Bread of Life Discourse" found in the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, the people cry out, "give us this bread always." Earlier in the passage, the people ask Jesus to give them a sign that they might see and believe in him. When Jesus gives the sign (himself as the bread of life), the Jews will murmur about Jesus (next week's Gospel). Are they ever satisfied? Are we ever satisfied?

As we continue through these hot summer days and weeks, perhaps we can ask ourselves if we grumble too much, if we murmur too much...about one another, about our civil leaders, about our bishop, our pastor, about God! Who do we complain about? Who do we complain to? What do we complain about? Do we recognize, acknowledge and celebrate the good that others do for us, for our community, our church? Do we thank God for the many blessings He has bestowed on us, for the many ways in which He has fed us, protected us, saved us?

Do we appreciate the gift of Jesus' presence in the Eucharist? Do we approach to receive Him worthily? What helps us to confirm our belief in the Lord? What gets in the way? May the week ahead bring you many blessings from God and evoke in you gratitude for His many blessings.

Some Ways You Can Help Us Grow...

Remember our Parish Family in your daily prayers.

(Whether you are in church or at home, remember we are always members of the Body of Christ)

Invite someone BACK to church who has been away

(It doesn't matter how long or the reason why.)

Invite someone to church for their FIRST time.

(Sacred Heart has a long legacy of being a welcoming Parish Family.)

Suggest Sacred Heart High School or Grade School to a neighbor, friend, or family member.

(There is still room and we are accepting new registrations as well as transfer students.)

Come back to church after baptizing a child.

(Jesus tells us, "Let the children come to me...and do not hinder them!")

Encourage the students (especially grandchildren, nieces and nephews) and their parents who recently celebrated the Sacraments of First Holy Communion or Confirmation to keep attending and participating in the life of the parish.

(We'd love to see them, celebrate with them, and share the Body of Christ with them – even after they've received these important Sacraments.)

Encourage alumni of Sacred Heart High School to reconnect with us.

(So many of our graduates speak highly of past teachers, classmates, programs they enjoyed at SHHS. But we need their contact information in order to reach out to them.)

RCIA & Religious Education Registration is Ongoing

As we enjoy the summer months and, hopefully, some well-deserved rest and relaxation, don't forget how easy it is to register for the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults** as well as our **Religious Education Program** for school children. Like the suggestions I already shared above, enrollment in these programs is a sign of hope and growth for the parish. Registration for RCIA can be made by calling the parish office or emailing Fr. John so that he can arrange an initial meeting with you. Registration for Religious Education can be completed on line by visiting the parish website.

Baptisms? Marriages?

If you have questions about the Sacraments of Baptism or Marriage, please don't hesitate to contact us at the office and schedule an appointment. Currently we are celebrating baptisms for one child/family at a time. It's always good to have a date in mind, as well as an alternate in case that date isn't available.

When planning for Marriage, please don't schedule a venue before checking with us about the availability of the church for that date. It does happen that the church may not always be available on the couple's first choice. Therefore, as with Baptisms, it good to have a date and an alternate in mind when coming to discuss the Sacrament of Marriage.

Thank You for Your Ongoing Awareness and Caution

As many of us have heard or read in the News, new cases of COVID-19, especially the Delta Variant, continue to rise around us, in our city, our county, our state and our country. Please let us continue to be vigilant as we enjoy the summer.

For those who have not yet been vaccinated, please continue to wear a mask while in church. Please also consider speaking with your health care provider about your concerns over the vaccine. What we have been hearing in the news is that the vast majority of new cases of COVID-19 are among those who have not been vaccinated.

For those who have been vaccinated, you should also feel free to wear a mask in church if it makes you more comfortable and adds another level of protection against the virus. While we have a professional sanitizing company come in each Sunday afternoon, it may be necessary to continue sanitizing the pews after each Mass, as they are sanitized each morning.

I am grateful for everyone's awareness of the fact that the virus is still a serious health concern. Each of us can do our part by washing or sanitizing our hands frequently, staying home if we feel ill, wearing a mask in large public gatherings and remaining aware of our surroundings.

Children who have **not** been Baptized, or who did not receive the Sacraments of First Eucharist or Confirmation at the "regular" time may begin this process beginning in September.



This process, known as **RCIA** (The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults), is the Church's way of preparing adults to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist.
