## From The Pastor's Desk

On Monday, June 29<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate the Solemnity of both Saints Peter and Paul. Did you know that a plenary indulgence may be gained on this day? Here is how: if one makes a devout use of a religious article blessed by a Bishop and recites any approved profession of faith and the usual conditions for plenary indulgences are met. A plenary indulgence is the removal of all temporal punishment. In order to receive a plenary indulgence one must have: be completely detached from sin (even venial sin), sacramentally confessed their sins, received Holy Eucharist and pray for the intentions of the Pope.

St. Paul was a convert to Christianity. He did not ever meet Jesus during His life on earth but lived during the same time. After deciding to convert, Paul (born Saul) received baptism and then withdrew to prepare himself for his mission for God. While he was on retreat, Jesus appeared to him personally. He then began his missionary work. He continued his mission until the year 66 when he returned to Rome. He was taken prisoner and beheaded a year later but his fourteen letters carried on his legacy and have enabled us to learn about his conversion as well as his faith.

St. Peter (born Simon) was given the name change to denote his role as leader of the apostles (and the Church) and as the Rock (Kephias). After Jesus' Ascension, Peter took his mission that Christ had entrusted to him – to be the leader of the Church. He delivered his first sermon on Pentecost and continued to preach throughout his life. Peter was Rome's first bishop and tradition states that he was also the first bishop of Antioch. He died a martyr, bound to a cross but his letters carried on his mission to inform and strengthen the faith of those who encountered these letters.

So this week, let us pray that we can be as strong in our faith like Saints Peter and Paul. We do not have to be martyrs to demonstrate our faithfulness. Our words and actions should be a sign to all that we are Christians.
