From our Pastor

Dear parishioners of St. Michael Church,

As you already know on January 10th I am starting boot camp for the US Army. That boot camp is called CHAPLAIN BASIC OFFICER LEADER COURSE.

"Chaplains and Chaplain Candidates do not go through Basic Training. Instead, they attend the Chaplain Basic Officer Leader Course (CH-BOLC), which is a 12-week course taught at the USA Chaplains Center and School (USACHCS) in Fort Jackson, S.C. Instruction at USACHCS is conducted by highly trained, professional, and experienced Army officers and non-commissioned officers (NCOs).

The Chaplain Basic Officer Leader Course (CH-BOLC) is an intensive, outcomes-based, entry-level, initial military training process. The training and special activities during this course provide unique opportunities for professional, physical, academic, and spiritual growth. CH-BOLC consists of four phases.

Chaplain Initial Military Training

Chaplain Initial Military Training (CIMT). This is the "basic training" phase in which Army Basic Officer Leader Course common core and Army Warrior tasks are trained.

Phase I

Training covers orientation to the U.S. Army Chaplain Corps and the professional staff officer skills needed to function in the Army.

Phase II

Training provides basic skills and pastoral ministry skills necessary to function as a chaplain at the battalion level.

Phase III

Training brings together leadership, professionalism, and Officership in field, garrison, and social environments. It culminates in a 72 hour situational training exercise (STX)."

The choices

"All kings shall pay him homage, all nations shall serve him. For he shall rescue the poor man when he cries out, and the afflicted when he has no one to help him. He shall have pity for the lowly and the poor; the lives of the poor he shall save."

We are so familiar with the persons of the scripture today, a devious king, star-gazing pilgrims, a baby and His mother. We know the gifts, the beckoning star, and the informative dream. We proclaim Jesus as the savior of all humankind.

As we reflect upon the words of the psalm we discover the mission of the Christ and hear the echo of the mission of Pope Francis. In his teaching in the Joy of the Gospel and in proclaiming the jubilee year of mercy, we are caught up with a special concern for those in great need. As the Holy Father and psalmist speak of the poor, we not only consider the economically downtrodden, but those who are poor because they lack hope and direction, who are not able to find a place for Christ in their lives.

As the magi went seeking and discovered the One they sought, may we begin this new year with a concern for those in need and be the source of strength and support for them.

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6

Isaiah rejoices over the light and glory that will shine upon Jerusalem. He describes how the wealth of nations will be brought to Jerusalem, and travelers will arrive bearing gifts and praising God.

Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

Paul explains to the Ephesians that the Gentiles are now coheirs with the Jews. Through Jesus, they became members of the same body. Therefore, they would receive everything God had promised the Jewish converts if they followed Christ's teachings.

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

Astrologers from the east came looking for the newborn king of the Jews, which greatly disturbed King Herod. Herod wanted to kill Jesus, and asked the astrologers to return and tell him where Jesus was. The astrologers found Jesus and brought him gifts, but received a message in a dream telling them not to return to Herod.
