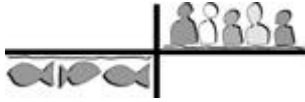

## FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

Isaiah recounts the awe he felt the first time he saw the Lord, who was surrounded by angels. He began to feel despair because he was a man of unclean lips, until an angel touched an ember to his lips and pronounced them clean. The Lord asked who he should send forth, to which Isaiah replied, "Here I am, send me!"

### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Paul reminds the Corinthians that Christ died for us to free us from our sins. He encourages them to remember the importance of Jesus' death and resurrection. He admits that he initially failed to believe, and therefore was very grateful to be called an apostle and preach in the name of Christ.

### Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Luke tells of Jesus preaching to a crowd, then joining Peter who was about to end a fruitless day of fishing. He told Peter to lower his net back in, and a great number of fish were caught. Upon seeing this, Peter and his companions, James and John, immediately abandoned their nets to follow Jesus.

## QUINTO DOMINICO EN TIEMPO ORDINARIO

### Primera Lectura: Isaías 6:1-2a, 3-8

Isaías cuenta la impresión que sintió la primera vez que vió al Señor rodeado de ángeles. Empezó a sentir desesperación porque era un hombre de labios impuros, hasta que un angel los tocó con una brasa y los purificó. Entonces el Señor preguntó a quién debía enviar, a lo que Isaías respondió: "Aquí estoy yo, envíame a mí".

### Segunda Lectura: 1 Corintios 15:1-11

Pablo les recuerda a los corintios que Cristo murió para liberarnos de nuestros pecados. Los alienta a recordar la importancia de la muerte y resurrección de Jesús. Admite que al principio no creyó, pero por eso está muy agradecido de ser llamado apóstol y predicar en nombre de Cristo.

### Evangelio: San Lucas 5:1-11

Lucas cuenta que Jesús había predicado a una multitud. Luego se unió a Pedro, quien no había pescado nada en todo el día. Le dijo a Pedro que tirara una vez más su red, y al hacerlo, agarró un gran número de peces. Al ver esto, Pedro y sus acompañantes, Juan y Santiago, inmediatamente abandonaron sus redes para seguir a Jesús.

En cualquier Misa a la que asistas, vas a escuchar decir diferentes cosas al momento de la plegaria eucarística. Eso es debido a que existen cuatro plegarias eucarísticas principales en el Misal Romano. La plegaria I es conocida también como Canon Romano donde están incluidas algunas oraciones de los santos y mártires. La plegaria II es la más corta y por lo general la más utilizada durante la misa diaria. La plegaria III es una forma abreviada del Canon Romano, y la plegaria Eucarística IV es mucho más larga y fue moldeada después de algunas liturgias de la iglesia Oriental.

Las cuatro plegarias eucarísticas son similares en su estructura e incluyen acción de gracias y aclamación, una oración para la venida del espíritu Santo, la narración de la institución, la conmemoración, el ofertorio, intercesiones y una doxología final «Por Cristo, con él y en él...», con la que se expresa solemnemente la glorificación de Dios.

En la plegaria eucarística, nos convertimos en participantes del sacrificio de Cristo, cuando el sacerdote hace lo que Jesús le pidió a sus apóstoles hacer: cambiar el pan en su Santo Cuerpo y el vino en su Preciosísima Sangre.

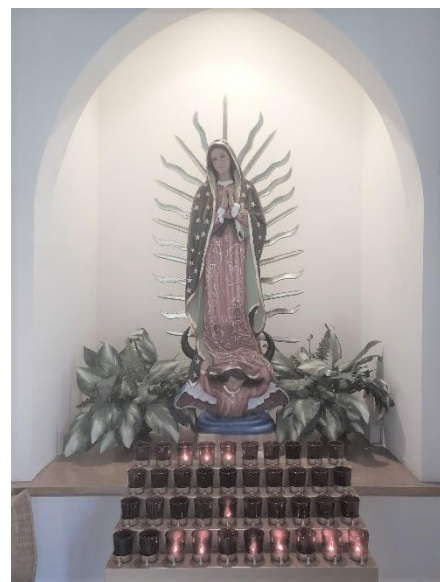
