## "BECOME A SAINT"

#### Dear Friends:

So you are thinking of what to do during Advent. Maybe you have made some commitments. It could be that you are doing random acts of kindness at least once a day. Maybe you are checking out giving more time to prayer. Perhaps you considered spending more quiet time, moving into a reflective place during all the noise and craziness of the season.

Well, how about becoming a saint? Many Christian thinkers and writers have said that the Christian life could be summed up in one goal: becoming a saint. An old Italian priest used to repeat over and over again to everyone: "Fatti Santo." "Become a Saint." Perhaps that should be our goal - your goal and mine.

It is too fantastic? Is it just too much to ask? Is it too far beyond your reach? Not if you look at the lives of the saints, and look at them honestly.

Sometimes we read the lives of saints and we see miracles and superhuman acts of virtue. We see saints as people different than us, kind of like superhumans with superpowers. That's why when we read lives of the saints, it is important to read real honest and authentic accounts, so we can see their faults and doubts and mistakes.

You might have recently read of Mother Teresa and how she became a saint. She has told us about her difficult periods where she struggled in many different ways. There is St. Jeanne Jugan, founder of the Little Sisters of the Poor, who was actually kicked out at one point from her own Order. The great St. John of the Cross was even confined and imprisoned by his own Order!

My point here is that if they can do it, you can do it. It is easy to be discouraged in this life in this world. There are so many distractions and so many things to stop us from fulfilling our vocation: to become a saint. But we can do it, with the immense power of God's grace. The season of Advent might be just the time to begin the journey to sainthood.
